



SERMON NOTES



Today we continue our 2020 summer sermon series on Biblical Prayers. In John's gospel, chapter 17, we find a prayer offered by Jesus which is commonly known as *The High Priestly Prayer*. In His role as the ultimate High Priest, Jesus prayed this prayer just before entering the Garden of Gethsemane to begin His passion and eventual crucifixion.

The High Priestly Prayer is passionate, poetic, and reveals the concerns that flowed from the lips of Jesus as He faced the end of His life and earthly ministry. This prayer focuses on the unique and divine relationship between God the Father and God the Son, and on the current and future disciples who would bear witness to the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

In this prayer, Jesus acknowledged that His disciples would face opposition, even hatred, because of God's word and the disciples' counter-culture commitment to God's Kingdom values. As we live in an age where there is increasing hostility to Christians and the Christian Church, the words of Jesus are quite relevant, and we would be wise to learn from them.

- In John 17:1-5, Jesus prayed and affirmed His oneness with God and how God has been glorified by His ministry. One of the essential tenets of the Christian faith is the Trinity, that there is one God in three distinct persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. John 10:30 affirms this when Jesus said, "I and the Father are one." Reflect on your understanding of the Trinity. In what ways do you find it comforting? Confusing?
- In John <u>17:6-8</u>, Jesus affirmed that He had taken what God had given Him and had manifested the truth of God to His disciples. Another essential tenet of the Christian faith is the Incarnation; that God became human in the person of Jesus Christ, in order to show humanity the true nature of God. By knowing Jesus, how have you experienced the vast and mysterious nature of God?
- The major focus of Jesus' prayer is on behalf of His current and future disciples. The first petition is a request that God would keep the disciples in God's Name. This is a prayer for identity. This is a prayer for protection. How do you understand being kept in God's Name? How does this shape your identity and perspective?
- The second petition is a request for unity. Jesus prays that "they may be one." Yet another essential tenet of the Christian faith is the unity of the Body of Christ (the Church.) This means that in Christ, we belong to the same spiritual family of faith, and are united by the one and only Savior, Jesus. In the midst of our current division and polarization, how have you experienced Christian unity? What strains it? How can you help toward strengthening it?
- The third petition is a prayer of protection from the evil one. Ironically, Jesus didn't ask that believers would be taken out of the world in order to remove them from any temptation or harm. Rather, He chose to have us remain in this world, but wanted us to be kept from the evil one. This reveals another essential tenet in that, as Christians, our true citizenship is not of this world, but of the heavenly realm. We are resident aliens and sojourners. But while we're in this world, we become engaged in a spiritual battle. In what ways have you engaged in this battle? What would you consider your (God's) victories?
- The final petition in our text is a prayer for God to sanctify the disciples in God's truth. Sanctification is also an essential tenet in that it describes the work of God in our lives to transform us gradually toward holiness. Sometimes this work is painful as God prunes unhealthy branches from our lives. Sometimes this work is joyful as God calls us and gifts us to do amazing Kingdom work. What has been your experience with God's sanctification?
