This is the second in our four-part kickoff sermon series on Acts <u>chapter 2</u> and <u>chapter 8</u>. The Holy Spirit came on Pentecost; the Apostle Peter preached a dramatic sermon to the crowd; many received and welcomed the Good News. Now what? What happens next? There are 3,000 brand new believers, who really are just *infants* in the faith. What is recommended for tomorrow? Next week? Next month? Next year? Those are the questions our text for today addresses

- 1. Have you ever had something big happen to you, but it was hard to sustain it? You didn't want your zeal to flag or end up being superficial in your commitment or follow through. What did you do (or not do)?
- 2. Read <u>Acts 2:42-47</u>. What were the Spiritual Disciplines that the first Christians practiced? Differentiate each one. How would you describe the community? Was it austere or joyous or reverent or some combination of several emotions?
- 3. I talked in my sermon from Dallas Willard's book, *The Spirit of the Disciplines*, about the difference between "trying" and "training." What is an example of each from your life? What does it mean for you that the first Christians "devoted themselves" (vs. 42) to the disciplines described in this passage? Which are you strong at right now? Which weak? Are you balanced or "off-kilter" in your responses to the Gospel based on the picture I drew on a white board during my message?
- 4. In verse 47, a faithful translation could be something like, "they were praising God and everyone liked them—or the disciples enjoyed the favor of all the people around them." Is that typical of Christians today? Why or why not? What would have to change for most people in society to have that attitude toward followers of Jesus today?
- 5. Further, verse 47 stated God "kept adding" to their midst those who "were being saved." What does "kept adding" and "being saved" mean to you? We keep growing in our maturity and in our witness to others. We have not "arrived," yet. This fall, how might you train to keep growing in your knowledge of Christ and your service in His name? As you close, pray for each other in your group.
