SERMON NOTES

Sunday, September 13, 2020



For the next eight weeks, we will look at how the Gospel is "radical" and addresses "radical" things like Evil, Joy, Humility, Preparation, Response, Generosity, etc. MDPC has talked about a commitment to *Radical* Generosity from its inception. *Radical* connoted far-reaching and thorough, even drastic. It can mean extreme change in a negative sense or, on the other side, people committed to some good thing, possibly even to the point or putting your reputation or life on the line for that greater positive—a willingness to sacrifice something valuable for something else even better. In our series, *Radical*, we are suggesting the second rather than the first definition. A while back, people would say that something was "rad," meaning something even better than excellent or awesome. Let's look at how a radical Savior addresses Radical Evil this week.

- 1. For many non-Christians, the biggest obstacle to faith is the presence of suffering and evil. How could a loving and all-powerful God allow evil? Have you ever felt that way? How do you think the Gospel addresses that problem?
- 2. Read <u>Matthew 13:24-30</u>. Whom do the servants blame for the weeds in verse 27? What is the owner's explanation from verse 28? Also, in verse 28, the servants propose a solution. What is it? Does the owner agree? What is his solution in verses 29-30?
- 3. Read <u>verses 36-43</u>. It is not every day that Jesus explains a parable to His followers, but He, in response to the disciples' request, offers His answer. According to Jesus, who sows the seed? What is the field? Who are the good seeds? Who are the weeds? Who is the enemy? What is the harvest? Who are the reapers? And what is the final outcome for the weeds and the wheat?
- 4. What is comforting from Jesus' explanation? Is there anything that is troubling? Explain and discuss.
- 5. In the last part of my sermon, I talked about one or two explanations of suffering and evil—at least one coming from our parable and its interpretation by Jesus. Where, if any-where, were they helpful? And where do you still have questions? Do you have another explanation for suffering and evil that is significant and satisfying to you? Share it so we can learn and have more arrows in our quiver for when the question is asked of us by friends or opponents of our faith.

For further reading, Rebecca McLaughlin has a chapter on this subject of suffering and evil in *Confronting Christianity: 12 Hard Questions for the World's Largest Religion*. Tim Keller does, as well, in *The Reason for God: Belief in an Age of Skepticism*. Enjoy.
