





The reality of faith and doubt we're focusing on in our post-Easter sermon series drives us to consider just how important faith is and the true nature of faith itself. Is it the amount, quality, or kind of faith we bring to the table that's most important? Or is the crucial element the object of our faith? Mark 9:14-29, with a focus on verse 23-24 as the center of the passage, helps us to explore this vital issue.

1. Take a look at the passage as a whole. Observe what's happening in the following sections. Jot down a few notes regarding "who, what, when, where, and how."

Mark 9:14-15 (Jesus returns from the Mount of Transfiguration)

Mark 9:16-19 (The argument in the crowd)

Mark 9:20-22 (Bringing the boy to Jesus)

Mark 9:23-34 (The interaction of Jesus and the boy's father)

Mark 9:25-27 (The actual healing/exorcism)

Mark 9:28-29 (The disciples' question)

2. I think Mark 9:23-24 is central to understanding this passage. How does he make his case as he talks about the sections above?

Drill into the interaction between Jesus and the boy's father in Mark 9:23-24.

- 3. How do you interpret what Jesus says to the boy's father in verse 23? Is Jesus being demanding? Ironic? Sarcastic?
- 4. I believe there are three possible ways to read Jesus's declaration to the boy's father in verse 23, but only one way that makes sense with the Bible's overarching story. Thoughts and responses?
- 5. How does the Tim Keller quote in the sermon about the importance of the object of our faith help us understand our own struggle with faith?
- 6. How do you hear and interpret the father's response to Jesus in verse 24? (Especially in light of what I said about verse 23?)
- 7. Were you surprised by the John Calvin quote about the father's response in verse 24? How so? What does Calvin say about the nature of faith and doubt, and God's response? How does this understanding both assure and encourage us in our own struggles with faith and doubt?
