This is the third week in our five-week post-Easter series on faith and doubt. My attempt in week one was to suggest from Scripture that most doubt is an expected part of being human and also living in a broken and sinful world; that much doubt is "not the opposite of faith, but an element of it," as Paul Tillich suggested. Then, last week, Pastor Clay helped us see it is not the amount of faith that matters, but the object of our faith that is critical. Jesus Christ is the center of our faith; and it is in His faith-fulness that our lives stand instead of fall. Today we turn to the Letter of James, 1:1-8 & 4:8, where a more toxic version of doubt is introduced and must be confronted.

- 1. What have been the biggest takeaways for you from the first two messages in this series? Was there a promise to claim, an attitude to change, a command to obey, an example to follow, an error to avoid, an insight to embrace, something to praise God for or be thankful of, or something else to celebrate?
- 2. When you doubt, what form does the doubt usually take? Is it a question about God, yourself, or some doctrine or subject, like the problem of suffering? How have you tried to work through that issue in the past? Did it work? Why or why not?
- 3. Read James 1:1-8 and 4:8. Why are the 12 tribes in dispersion, do you think, in verse 1? James says in verse 2, not *if* you face trials, but *when* you face trials, do these specific things. What are the things, according to verses 2-8, we are to do? Do you regularly do those things or are you tempted to do something else when there are trails? What other things might you do that are not productive?
- 4. In verse 6-8, the subject of *faith* and *doubt* is introduced. What is the advice? Look also at James 4:8. Does that verse add anything helpful? If so, what?
- 5. The Greek Word here for doubt is *dipsychos*, which means being a divided person or having two minds (being double-minded) about something crucial. The Chinese speak memorably about a person having one foot in two boats. I mentioned in my sermon that this kind of doubt sometimes causes people to stop in their tracks and not move, be stuck, become indecisive, or fail to act. That posture produces devastating results. When have you seen this happen in other people's lives and faith? How about yours?
- 6. In John 1 when Jesus calls the first disciples, He invites them by saying, "Come and see." Then, after they have seen, He says, "Follow Me." How do these invitations help us overcome *dipsychos* or being double-minded? In my message, I gave a couple of examples of when action is needed to overcome indecision. Where might that be needed in your life right now? Did any of the Youth Sermons inspire you to new belief?
