





This is the fourth message in our five-week spring series on *faith* and *doubt*. Thomas gets a bad nickname for all time ("Doubting Thomas") because he did not believe (he could not believe) at first. However, he was able to work through his doubt and come out on the other side with maybe the greatest profession of faith in all of Scripture. How did that happen? Why did that change occur? What can we learn from his mistake and his correction? From what we see in his words and actions, he did *not* become or remain double-minded (in Greek, *dipsychos*, which I talked about last Sunday from James 1).

- 1. What has been your biggest insight so far in our faith and doubt series? What questions do you still have that have not been answered? How might you go about finding solid answers or resolution for your doubt(s)?
- 2. In John 20:1-18, Mary Magdalene first sees the empty tomb and then meets the risen Christ. She tells the disciples and John and Peter run to the tomb to confirm her words. Then Jesus appears to Mary and tells her to go announce certain things to the other disciples. Read John 20:19-31. First focus on verses 19-23. What day is it? What time is it? Where does this appearance of Christ occur? Why is the door locked? And finally, what does Jesus say to them, what does He show them, and what does He give them?
- 3. Focus on verses 24-25. What do the disciples say to Thomas? Does it convince him? Why or why not, do you think?
- 4. Attend to verses 26-29. What is the same and what is different about this scenario one week later? What did Jesus say to Thomas? What is Thomas' response? Why is that response such an amazing profession of faith? And what gentle rebuke does Jesus offer to Thomas and other potential followers?
- 5. In my sermon, I talked about one virtue Thomas had and one mistake he made. Where can we learn from his example? Where might you believe or trust (put your weight down on the faithfulness of God's word) even if you can't *see*? (vs. 29)
- 6. Verses 30-31 close out the passage. What do these words say the purpose of this Book is? Is the goal good or bad, life or death? Why does this postscript matter here and to you personally?
