



This is the final one-off sermon of the spring before we begin our summer preaching series, called *Unburdened*, on Paul's letter to the Galatians. This also is Pentecost Sunday, when we celebrate the giving of the Holy Spirit to the Disciples in Acts chapter 2. However, I want us to look at how the Holy Spirit helps real apprentices when they are experiencing real struggles because of really following Jesus. Peter is writing to Gentile Christians in Asia Minor (modern -day Turkey) and showing them how to handle pressure and suffering in the real world.

- 1. Check in with the other members of the group about how you are doing, on a scale of 1-10 (10 being the best), regarding your energy level and patience and joy at the end of a long program or school or pandemic year. What might you need to do this summer to recharge your batteries and renew your mind to be ready for a post-pandemic fall?
- 2. Are you experiencing any trouble or suffering because of your faith in Christ? What form is it taking for you? For a friend of yours? For Christians in another part of the world?
- 3. Read 1 Peter 4:12-16. What does the Apostle Peter say we should not be surprised by or consider strange? According to Peter, how are we *blessed not disgraced*? And why are we supposed to glorify God?
- 4. Read 1 Peter 5:6-11. What four things are we supposed to do in verses 6-9? What two things will God do, according to those verses? What extra things will God do in verse 10?
- 5. Dwell on 1 Peter 5:10 for a little while. Why do we sometimes attempt these matters on our own? Can we really restore, support, strengthen, and establish ourselves? Why not? Why does our attempt at control or "playing God" fail in the end? Why do these blessings have to come as a gift from God's Spirit? What is your takeaway about the Spirit from these verses?
- 6. From my illustration of "The Inner Ring" by C. S. Lewis in my sermon, what entanglement (Inner Ring) might you need to approach differently, or character quality might you develop, with the Spirit's help, to handle the pressures of the groups/rings around you?
