We've given it that title because we are truly "unburdened" from sin, guilt, hopelessness, and all that goes with them through the only true gospel there is! The good news of Jesus Christ, crucified and risen, and His grace alone!

A major theme of Galatians is the tension between Galatian Christians regarding what was necessary to attain righteousness before God. Some argued that in order to be in a right relationship with God, the Old Testament Law had to be obeyed along with having faith in Jesus as Savior and Lord. This "Jesus plus something else (in this case, the Law of Moses)" is completely antithetical to the gospel in Paul's mind. He communicates his dismay and correction to the Galatian Christians forthrightly and urgently.

In Galatians 1:3-9, Paul unpacks three things: 1) the core of what makes up the gospel of Jesus Christ; 2) the pretense of what poses as a "different gospel" that deliberately twists truth and fools people; and 3) the danger of such different gospels spiritually.

As you talk about the passage and the sermon, consider the following helps for study and discussion:

- 1. Why is Paul getting so bent out of shape about the Galatian Christians' new beliefs and actions? Is he out of line here, or is there something so significant about what the Galatians are doing that it jeopardizes their very spiritual welfare? What are they doing that causes Paul such heartburn?
- 2. What are key words you see in verses 3-5 that describe the core of the Christian good news in Jesus? List them. Define them. Elaborate on why they're so important.
- 3. What is the pretense that the Galatian Christians have devised about the simple gospel of Jesus? What makes it particularly sneaky and problematic?
- 4. Why is it so helpful to be able to tell the genuine from the fake, the real from the pretentious? Share some experiences you've had when you're uncovered the truth. Share some experiences when you've been deceived.
- 5. Why is the "different gospel" mentioned in verses 6-7 considered so dangerous in verses 8-9? Talk about the depth of Paul's warning to the Galatian Christians.
- 6. A clear implication of this passage is that different gospels of "Jesus plus something else" are offered up with regularity in today's world. The sermon mentions at least three. What are your thoughts? What would you add or subtract?
- 7. How can we focus on the simple, unadorned gospel today? What might change if we did so with consistency and conviction?
