SERMON NOTES by Pastor Beth Case



Phone calls, text messagess, letters, Zoom meetings – each serves a purpose. But the topic on Paul's heart calls for an in-person conversation. The revelation he has received from Jesus has provided him with the confidence to share the Gospel of God's grace with Gentiles, inviting them to know salvation by faith in Christ alone. But it has come to Paul's attention that his ministry differs from that of his Jewish counterparts who uphold the Jewish requirement of male circumcision as a prerequisite for saving faith.

With this in mind, Paul travels to Jerusalem to meet with the apostles there. Paul brings with him two trusted members of his mission team: a compatriot, Barnabas, and a younger church-planting pastor, Titus, who happens to be a Gentile. The meeting between these leaders is one of the most formative meetings for the church at that time – a meeting whose outcome ripples out to us!

- 1. Imagine that as you prepare for a very important meeting, you become increasingly aware that the outcome will profoundly affect your life and the lives of family and friends for decades to come. Who would you take to the meeting as compatriot? As a mentee? How might Paul's choice of Barnabas and Titus be significant for the meeting with Jerusalem apostles?
- 2. It is likely that the meeting written of in Galatians 2:1-10 prevented a major church split. What wisdom might be gleaned for seeking unity among different cultures and perspectives? How did Paul both assert his independence from the Jerusalem apostles, while also practicing solidarity?
- 3. Read Galatians 2:4-5. How do the goals of the false believers compare to Paul's goals?
- 4. We often think of "taking a stand" as working against harmful or immoral behavior. But the stand Paul takes is against the pressure to be "super-moral." Why was this stance important?
- 5. When have you been tempted to utilize external signs to measure salvation either for yourself or others? How did this play out for you?
- 6. Which one of the following truths is most radical for you to believe? How might it affect your relationships with God and others if you were confident enough in God's grace to know that by the regenerating strength of the Holy Spirit, you are:
 - a child of God (John 1:12);
 - free from condemnation; cannot be separated from the love of God (Romans 8:38-39);
 - bought with a price, belonging to God (1 Corinthians 6:19-20);
 - hidden with Christ in God (Colossians 3:1-4);
 - given a spirit of power, love, and sound mind rather than a spirit of fear. (2 Timothy 1:7)?
- 7. To remember the poor is both doctrinal and practical (Psalm 140:12; Proverbs 14:21, 31; Luke 12:6). Why might the remembrance of the poor be included in this discussion of the Gospel and of unity?
