



This is the first in our fall series, *Better Together*. Why do we need each other? Way back in Genesis chapter two, the Lord God said, "It is not good that the man should be alone." Think about that for a minute. Before the fall in Genesis 3, God spoke those words. This means before sin entered the world (in ch. 3), the need for community was part of our perfection and not imperfection. Also, in the second half of the Book of Acts, in ninety-seven places in Acts chapters 16-28, the writing changes from third person (he, she, they, them) to first person plural (we). Ministry was done in teams. Are you part of any teams, to share, to grow, to learn, to serve, to build, and to live out your faith?

- 1. I provided some context leading up to the second missionary journey of Paul and his companions. What hit you from that introduction?
- 2. Read Acts 16:1-5. All summer we talked in our Galatians sermon series that circumcision was not necessary for salvation. Then why did Paul have Timothy circumcised? Read Gal. 2:1-5 about Titus, and 1 Cor. 9:12-23 about Paul's approach to different people groups. Does Acts 16:3 conflict with his teaching in Galatians? Or is he somehow consistent? Explain.
- 3. I talked in my message about trying to discover God's will for our lives. In this first section, how is finding a person like Paul if you are Timothy and finding a person like Timothy if you are Paul part of God's will for us?
- 4. Read Acts 16:6-10. I talked about various ways God can let us know the divine will in a certain circumstance. In what form(s) did God's *forbidding them* from going to Asia and *not allow them to go* to Bithynia manifest itself? How has God spoken or led you in the past? What forms has that guidance taken? What can you learn from this section?
- 5. Read Acts 16:11-15. How did God's previous "no" open the way for a big "yes"? What is the big win in Philippi? How does this show God breaking down the wall of hostility between regions and people groups?
- 6. Where might you be a Paul to some Timothy? Where might you be a Timothy to some Paul? What aspect of listening for God's will might you incorporate into your life because of this master's class by Paul and his companions? Ministry was done in teams. What team are you a part of right now? If not, how will you correct that deficiency?
