



SERMON NOTES by Rev. Dr. Alf Halvorson



If last week's text was a master class on "discerning God's will," then this week's passage is a case study on what *freedom* is and what it does and does not look like in real people's lives. There is freedom, and then there is freedom.

- 1. What is your definition of freedom? I preached on August 1 on Galatians 5:1-15. Read that text again and listen to the message if you missed it and can find time (<u>sermons.mdpc.org</u>). How is our secular definition of freedom (freedom as no limits or rules or restrictions) unworkable, untenable, and unsustainable? What does Paul say freedom in Christ really looks like?
- 2. When in your life have you felt enslaved? When free? How would you describe your life overall right now? What factors contribute to your imprisonment or freedom?
- 3. Read Acts 16:16-40 with an eye on who in the narrative is free and who is enslaved. What about the slave girl? Is she imprisoned or not? What about her owners? The magistrates and crowd? Paul and Silas? The Roman jailer? Lydia? What impresses you about some of the characters and disappoints or disgusts you about others?
- 4. Focus on the Roman jailer for a moment. Does holding the keys make you free? Why or why not? How is he enslaved? What question does he ask of Paul and Silas? What is their answer? Have you answered that question in your own life? Why or why not? What happens next in response to this question & answer session? How do Paul and Silas help the jailer become free? And how does the jailer return the favor?
- 5. There is an axiom which says, "In the end, we love people into belief. We do not argue them into belief." Do you agree? How is that true or not true here?
- 6. Acts 16:15, 34, and 40 (the passages we have looked at this fall thus far) include examples of genuine hospitality. Why are we less and less willing and able to invite people into our homes? Someone told me recently they feel enormous expectations to have a perfect house and be a perfect host. But hospitality only works if there is not a performance expectation trap, but rather the focus is meant to be on the visitors in care and service. How might you and I be more like Lydia and the jailer this week or month because of our Christian faith?
