This is the fifth in our fall 2020 series on God's *radical* nature and love for us, and the opportunity for us to not just live a bland life but live *radically* for God and others. We have been looking at Jesus' parables from the Gospel of Matthew. Today, we look at a parable that occurs after Jesus has entered Jerusalem on the Monday of Holy Week. He has cleansed the temple; cursed a fig tree; the chief priests and elders have asked Him, "By what authority do You do these things?" He has answered, "I will ask you a question. If you tell Me the answer, then I will also tell you by what authority I do these things. Did the baptism of John come from heaven, or was it of human origin?" They don't answer Him because either answer will make them look bad. Then He tells them the parable for today. So Jesus is talking to religious people who were not doing what they believed. They weren't following the will of the Father.

1. As a child, when did you tell your mother or father you would do something they wanted that you had no intention of doing? Or when as a parent did your child promise to do something you wanted done, but they did not follow through? Share humorous or not-so-humorous stories.
2. Read [Matthew 21:28-32](#). What is Jesus trying to say to the chief priests, the elders, and the crowd? What is the lesson to learn?
3. In verse 29 and 32, the same basic word is used in the Greek and translated into English as "he changed his mind" and "you did not change your minds." The Greek word is *metamelomai*, which means "feel regret, feel repentant." Metanoia, a slightly different Greek word, means "change of heart" or "turn around and go in the opposite direction." Metamelomai means the experiencing of remorse that could lead to metanoia (turning around and going in the opposite direction). Make sense? What did the first son feel regret or remorse about, do you think? Why is that the first critical step toward "turning around" and ultimately "doing the will of the Father"? (vs. 31)
4. Three times Jesus uses the word *believe* in verse 32. This word doesn't just mean verbal assent to some idea, but actually putting that idea into practice; walking it out; showing by your life or behavior that you agree and are following the will of the Father practically. How does this understanding (and this parable) help you see what Jesus intends for those who are His disciples? Are you more like the first son in the parable or the second (the chief priests and the elders were more like the second)? Where this week can you walk out your faith? Where can you believe by and through your daily life?
