SERMON NOTES



This is the seventh and final in our fall *Radical* series that concludes on Covenant Sunday, when, as an act of worship to God, we make our financial pledges for 2021. It is another parable by Jesus from the Gospel of Matthew, and the parable occurs right after Peter asks the Savior, "How often should I forgive? As many as seven times?" Other rabbis of the time said three times was generous; Jesus says, "Not seven times, but I tell you, 77 times." (Note: The Greek here is difficult, so the phrase could be translated "77 times seven.") Then Jesus offers our parable for today. How does a parable in response to a question like Peter's help us to think through our stewardship/generosity?

- 1. If you had to explain what Christianity says about forgiveness, what would you say? When have you failed at forgiveness? When have you succeeded at it?
- 2. Read <u>Matthew 18:23-34</u>. Focus on verses 18-27 first. Who is the debtor? How big is the debt? What does the lord (king) order? How does the slave respond? What does the king do in the end? Why does the king release him and forgive his debt?
- 3. How does the first third of the parable relate to the Good News of Christianity? Who is the debtor? How big is the debt? What does God order? How might we respond? What does God do in the end? Under what circumstances does God release us and forgive our debt?
- 4. Now read the second third of the parable, the part not to be imitated, verses 28-30. Who is the debtor? How big is the debt? What does the one who has the upper hand order? How does the slave respond? What does the upper-hand one do in the end? Why does he not release the slave and forgive his debt?
- 5. Now read the final third of the parable, verses 31-35. How is the king brought back into the situation? How does he react? What does he say to the one who previously had the upper hand in section two? And what is Jesus' final word in <u>verse 35</u>?
- 6. How does this parable, and especially verse 35 apply to you/us? And how does God being generous to us relate to our generosity in return? How might this parable impact your pledge?
