# SERMON NOTES



This is the first in our second Fall sermon series leading us through Advent and to Christmas Eve. In late May/early June of this year, when I was working on the sermon schedule for the next 12 months, I thought we might need reminders on how God is love and that we are called to love not only after a divisive election season, but also as a basis distinctive of being a Christ-follower.

Shortly before He was arrested, Jesus said to His disciples, "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are My disciples, if you have love one for another" (John 13:34-35). In other words, the one main difference between the behavior of non-Christians and Christians was to be *agape* love. Christians were/are to be noticeably more loving. What does that mean? What does that look like? Possibly the supreme words ever penned (prose or poetry) on love were written by Paul in 1 Corinthians 13. And they were not written (with the Holy Spirit's inspiration) just for weddings or married couples, but for disciples trying to follow Christ both in the church and out in the world.

- 1. If you were to describe fake love or sham love, what would it look like to you? What would an example of true or genuine love be for you?
- 2. Read <u>1 Corinthians 13:1-14:1a</u>. For Paul, what "things" end or cease? And what qualities abide or endure or never end (are eternal)? Which is the greatest quality? What does it mean to you that some things "pass away," but others endure?
- 3. In <u>1 Corinthians 13:1-3</u>, which is our focus for today, Paul describes qualities that often are lauded in our world. What are the qualities? Is Paul saying they are bad in and of themselves? Why, under certain circumstances, are they dangerous or inadequate alone? Give negative examples of these qualities detached from agape love.
- 4. According to Paul, why is agape love so critical? Why does our motivation matter? Why might the attitude of our heart matter?
- 5. Read <u>1 John 4:7-21</u>. How does this text help you understand "who God is" and how you and I might live out 1 Cor. 13:1-3?
- 6. Where specifically might God be prompting you to pursue love, strive for love, run after love, exhibit love, share love, practice love, risk love this week?
