
Children's Sunday School and Childcare

This is the fifth in our series leading up to Christmas on 1 Corinthians 13 and the topic of Agape Love. We diagnosed shallow substitutes for love (according to Paul) in verses 1-3, we fleshed out two positive qualities (*patient*, *kind*) in verse 4a, and we walked through eight negative characteristics that are not agape. Now we get to five new qualities of this love, then a set of illustrations of things that are partial and not complete, or temporary and not permanent, except love.

- 1. If Advent is about waiting (waiting for God in the Christ child to arrive), then we are quite familiar with things that are partial and not complete—or temporary and not permanent. For what things in your life (or in our world right now) are you sick of waiting, because they are incomplete?
- 2. Read <u>1 Corinthians 13:7-12</u> in a couple different translations. In verses 7-8a, Paul offers five sweeping claims about agape to end that section with a flourish. Does his summary ring true for you? For example, what does "believes all things" mean? Didn't we just say in verse 6 that love rejoices in the truth?
- 3. I said in my reading of the Scripture that Ralph Martin, a well-respected British New Testament Scholar, helped me understand these five phrases. *Panta* in Greek does not mean "all things" as the best translation, but, rather, "always." The NIV Translation picks up on this insight. So, these verses could be translated "always it covers; always it believes; always it hopes; always it endures; Love never ends (or, rather, is eternal)." Another way of saying it is "There is nothing agape love cannot face; there is no limit to its faith, its hope, its endurance." How does that explanation change your reading and understanding here?
- 4. Focus on verses 8b-12. How would you summarize what Paul is trying to say here in one or two sentences? Why did the Corinthians and why do we seem to prize prophecy, tongues, and knowledge (some of the gifts of God from chapter 12) so highly? How can agape love be even higher or more important?
- 5. There is a Christian praise song which says, "I am fully known and loved by You (God)." We fear that if God or others fully knew us, they would run from us and hate us. In what ways does the Bible say that God fully "agapes" us even though He fully knows us? How does verse 12 help?
- 6. Where and how might we extend the agape love we have received by God back to Him and outward to others who cross our path in the coming days?
