SERMON NOTES by Pastor Alf Halvorson



This is the seventh and final Advent text in our series on agape love. I chose <u>Revelation 2:1-7</u> because the book of Revelation begins, according to Rev. 1:1, "The revelation of Jesus Christ." Jesus is the gift God gives us at Christmas.

John, while he was exiled on the Isle of Patmos, had a vision/revelation, not only of what the end of the world would be like because of Jesus Christ, but also what to say in the present to the persecuted churches in Asia Minor (modern day Turkey) to help them be faithful in challenging times. Included in the book are seven letters to seven churches in Asia Minor at the time. The first letter was to the church at Ephesus. This city is where the Apostle Paul lived for three and a half years as he shared Christ with the Gentiles. It had a great harbor for commerce on the Aegean Sea and bustled with trade, being the end of the silk trade route from the East and the link to Rome in the West. It also had the third largest library in the Ancient World, as well as the Temple of Artemis (the revered fertility figure), one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World. Each letter from John follows a uniform pattern: affirmation first, then correction, and finally a promise if faithfulness follows.

- 1. Read Rev. 2:1-7. How does John show agape love (that we learned about in 1 Cor. 13) toward this church in Ephesus?
- 2. How are they affirmed? Where are they corrected? And what promise awaits them if they are faithful? Where do these words from nearly 2,000 years ago speak to you/us at the end of a very challenging 2020? For example, where have you patiently endured (vs. 2)?
- 3. The *correction* part occurs in verses 4-5. They chose for a time to give up on agape love. Why do you think they abandoned the love they had at first? Can you remember a time in your life when you did the same thing? What causes the diversion from your primary or first love? And what is the prescription that is given here?
- 4. Did you ever have a time when faith came alive and you had a *first love* regarding Christ? Or maybe you grew up in a Christian household where you never doubted faith in Christ. What might *first love* look like faith-wise in either case? How can we be diverted from it? This Christmas, how might you return to your first love, according to this passage?
- 5. Christmas, whether we are near or far from family and friends, offers us a great opportunity to practice and display agape love toward others and God. What "works" (vs. 5) might you do this year *in response to* the amazing gift of agape love we receive in the person of Jesus the Christ—the Babe in the manger who is the Savior of the world?

May the peace and love Christ came to give be yours this Christmas in abundance!!! Pastor Alf
