



This is the second message in our series on a brief overview in four weeks of the entire Bible. What is the grand narrative we as believers or seekers need to see and understand to grasp the Good News of God? Last week we tried to communicate that God created all things *good*; but that, in freedom, we chose *bad*. And since those initial sins, it has been a good news/bad news story. One of God's blessings to humanity is *The Law*; we, however, often see the law and keepers of the law as irritants, or the law as a curse. What should our posture be toward the Law of God? What function does it serve, if any, even for the believer?

- 1. In general, when you think about the laws of the land or the laws of the road, do they make you happy or mad? Do they free you or inhibit you? In political debates over the last few years regarding Defund the Police or Blue Lives Matter, what are some of the abuses each of the sides is trying to correct?
- 2. Read Ex. 20:1-3. This is the introduction and first command of the Ten Commandments. From verse 2, what is the character of the One who gave us the Law? Does Law come first or Grace/Gospel come first here?
- 3. Some say that the Old Testament is about Law, and the New Testament is about the Gospel. But isn't there Gospel and Grace here in verse 2, even in the OT?
- 4. Some suggest that the New Testament is about Grace and Gospel and that the Law doesn't apply anymore to and for the believer. What does Matt. 5:17-20 say from Jesus' Sermon on the Mount? Is Jesus against the Law given in Exodus or for it? How do you make sense of Jesus' words here for your attitude toward the Law?
- 5. Read Romans 3:19-25a. According to Paul (who was one of the best legal scholars the world has ever known) and these verses, can we, as humans after the Fall, keep the Law? Then, according to Paul, what function does the Law serve? Look especially at verse 20.
- 6. If we are not saved by the Law, how does that occur, according to verses 21-25a?
- 7. So the Law doesn't save us; it reveals our sin like a mirror reveals how we measure up to God's perfect will. I used an illustration of a marriage from Martin Luther, the great reformer, to talk about how we can receive forgiveness and receive the benefits of Christ's life and death on our behalf through faith. How was that helpful or not helpful? Is there a better picture you have or could create to illustrate Paul's point and Christ's action on our behalf? Are you by faith married to Christ? If not, what is holding you back? Today you could commit your life to Him; He has already committed His life and death and resurrection to you. He just has been waiting on your faith for new life to begin or continue.
