


Wednesdays, Oct 27-Dec 8 • 10-11:30am



This is the fourth and final week in our short series on some of the most critical themes in Christianity. How does Scripture—in Genesis through Revelation—move us from one kind of home in a garden, to a New Heaven and a New Earthly home? The Christian conviction is that present-day earth is not all there is; there is more. In fact, as C. S. Lewis puts it, "There are far, far better things ahead than any we leave behind." What are some of those things ahead for the Christian? The Apostle John, imprisoned on the isle of Patmos, receives a vision from God of the doom of the wicked and the bliss of the Blessed. This *Revelation*, the pulling back of a curtain, is meant to enlighten us and give us peace and hope. The book is about power: God's good power, and the evil power of the other. But ultimately about the victory of God and the Lamb. Paradise lost is ultimately paradise regained.

- 1. In your life, what have you heard and read about the "world's ending" or heaven? Have those thoughts and themes given you comfort or produced fear?
- 2. Read Revelation 21:1-6. What did John see in verses 1-2? In verse 3, what four things happen? In verse 4, what are the good results of being in the physical presence with God?
- 3. We are back to the present time in verse 5. What does the One seated on the throne say to John? How do these words square with what you see in the world right now? Do you think that might be why the second sentence in verse 5 is present? It's sometimes hard to believe that in our world right now God is working to bring order out of chaos, life out of death, and to make all things new. Where might you pray for God to do that in your life and in our world right now?
- 4. In verse 6, we are no longer in the present but are talking about a future reality. What is promised? Where do you need living water?
- 5. Read Rev. 22:1-5. What are the waters of life and the trees of life for in verse 2? Isn't that a needed and wonderful promise? The phrase in verse 4, "see His face," regarding kings means to be granted an audience with. What do you think you might ask or do in God's awesome and loving presence? In verse 5, it's affirmed "they will reign forever and ever." There is only one God and the Lamb, but those with God have work to do that is meaningful and purposeful. I heard a mentor say one time, "Keep developing new character qualities and fruit of the spirt and nurture your gifts now, even if you are older, because you will have all of eternity to use them for the glory of God." What gift or character quality might you keep developing, anticipating you might be called to use that gift for the greater good in glory?
- 6. Reading Revelation 21 & 22 is incredibly important for perspective and our attitude in the present. Why does or how might *beginning with the end in mind* positively impact the way you/we live right now?
