This is the first of five messages on "A teachable moment on...," a series to be offered Nov 14 & 21, and Jan 9, 16, & 23. It will be the bread on each side of an Advent-and-Christmas sandwich.

Sometimes it is better not to talk about a subject when you are in the middle of a major decision or crisis regarding the matter, but rather when things are more stable; in that way you can have a more dispassionate, rational, and thoughtful *conversation*, rather than an emotionally-heightened-with-everything-on-the-line *fight*. Then, when the need arises, you can apply the gleanings won at room temperature to times when you are in the furnace or under pressure.

- 1. In your mind, how are friendships formed? Why are you friends with some people and not with others? And what factors apply to the sustaining of friendships?
- 2. How is marriage similar to and different from friendship? For instance, can there be a covenant between friends? Can there be intimacy between friends that is different from those who are married?
- 3. Read Eccl. 4:1-12. The first part is about sadness due to oppression, envy, and isolation. Then there is the short section, verses 9-12, regarding the *Value of a Friend*. Comment on the downside of being a human from the first eight verses. Then list the benefits of friendship stated in verses 9-12.
- 4. In your life, how have you experienced the first section? And how have you experienced the second section? Where have you been responsible for the first and second sections? Where might you need to confess sin or ask for forgiveness? And where might God be nudging you to invest going forward?
- 5. There is an interesting image or proverb in the second half of verse 12. Can you picture a rope with three strands woven together? What do you think the writer *intends* or *means* by this phrase in the context of this chapter? What is the third cord?
- 6. What does it suggest that Jesus is called a friend of tax collectors and sinners in Matt. 11:19? And that Jesus calls His disciples friends in Luke 12:4? And that Abraham was called the friend of God in James 2:23 because of his faith?
- 7. I shared quotes from Dietrich Bonhoeffer and C. S. Lewis in the second half of my message. What struck you from what they said? Finally, ponder the hymn, "What a Friend We Have in Jesus" and what that truth the song sings about means for your life. How is Jesus all the things talked about in Eccl. 4:9-12—and so much more?
