



Micah 5:2-5a; Luke 2:1-7 • Why This Place?

This is the fourth in our Advent series on Christmas Questions. Today we look at a prophecy from the Book of Micah which predicts the Messiah, Savior, Lord, will come from Bethlehem. Micah, one of the 12 minor prophets, lived in the Southern Kingdom and was a younger contemporary of Isaiah. He, along with Isaiah, Hosea, and Amos, burst on the scene in the eighth century B.C., and predicted God's judgment on both Israel (the Northern Kingdom) and Judah (the Southern Kingdom.) But they also foretold God would show mercy in the end if the people would repent. How can words from 700 years prior to Jesus' birth speak to the first century A.D.—and also to our own time?

- 1. Have you ever known anyone who made predictions or read books where the author prophesied? How successful were they? Why are most of these characters found out to be charlatans?
- 2. Yet the Bible is full of prophesies. Why does God (through human prophets) choose to give humans information before it occurs? Is it out of meanness or graciousness? Judgment or hoped-for repentance? Confusion or clarity? Why might your answers to the previous questions result in either comfort or concern to you and those you love?
- 3. Read Micah 5:2-5a and 6:6-8. What strikes you about these verses? What is meant by the phrase, "you...who are one of the little clans of Judah"? Whether large or small, insignificant or powerful, what does God require in Micah 6:6-8? How are you doing with this prescription? Perhaps our failures individually and as nations regarding this requirement caused God to send His Son. Ponder and discuss...
- 4. Read Luke 2:1-7 for the second time this Advent. How does this reading that is connected with Micah cause new thoughts and insights to bubble up? What hit you this time? Why was Jesus born in Bethlehem and in a stable? What is the point?
- 5. With Micah 6:6-8 in mind, ponder Jesus' whole life from birth through death and resurrection. How did Jesus live out perfectly what we couldn't live out, but what God requires? Be specific in your examples from the Gospels.
- 6. How does Jesus coming to our world, and to you, help you/us get back to God? How might you trust Jesus and His way of salvation for the first time (or again) this Christmas?
