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



John 1:1-9 • Why the Word & the Light?

This is the sixth in our Advent/Christmas series on questions surrounding Christmas. Today we look at the prologue to the Gospel of John in which Jesus is introduced as "the Word" and "the Light." Why did John choose those titles, and what do they mean for readers then and now?

- 1. When have you felt the opportunity and pressure of making an introduction? What was that like for you?
- 2. What might it have been like for John to make this introduction of Jesus?
- 3. If you were introducing Jesus, what word(s) would you utilize? Explain.
- 4. Each of the four Gospels chronicles the narrative of Jesus from a slightly different angle. Mark opens with Jesus in early adulthood, His ministry being introduced by John the Baptist. Luke writes of Jesus as a baby; it's Luke we turn to for details of the Christmas story. Matthew considers the ancestry of Jesus, tracing His family line back to Abraham. John opens not with the details of Jesus's life and ministry, but on the purpose on why His life and ministry happened. How might the focus of each be important both to the specific audience of each writer, and also to the overall narrative of Scripture?
- 5. Read Genesis 1:1-4a. What connections can you find between John 1:1-9 and the narrative of Creation?
- 6. The Greek words *logos* and *rhema* can both be translated into English as "word." *Logos* refers to the entire process of communication, while *rhema* refers to one part word(s) spoken. Knowing this, why do you suppose John chose *Logos* rather than *rhema* to introduce Jesus?
- 7. What can we learn from each of the following Scriptures about Jesus as *Logos* (The Word)? a) Psalm 33:6; b) Jeremiah 1:4; Ezekiel 31:1; c) Psalm 107:20.
- 8. When it comes to your walk with Christ, do you focus more on individual or singular *rhema* or on the totality of the revelation of God-revealed-in Christ *Logos*? How might a focus on each one affect your walk with Christ?
