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

John 1:10-18 (ESV) • How Does Jesus Make God Known?

On this first Sunday of the new year, we conclude our Advent and Christmas sermon series on the questions surrounding Christmas. During the past few Sundays, we've considered questions like: Why did the angels sing? Why Bethlehem? Why is Jesus called the Prince of Peace?

Today we conclude the series by considering this question: Why and How Does Jesus Make God Known? At the core of this question is the profound theological truth and mystery of the Incarnation. Simply put, the Incarnation affirms that God became a human being in the person of Jesus Christ. Therefore, if we want to know Who and What God is like, we find the answers in Jesus.

The first chapter of John's gospel has a beautiful and eloquent description of the Incarnation. John 1:14 sums it up: "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen His glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth."

- 1. In John 1:10, we find a statement about Jesus' role in creation: "He was in the world, and the world was made through Him..." Take a few moments to reflect on the meaning of this. In what ways does this shape your view of Jesus?
- 2. In John 1:11-12, we see that people reacted differently to the coming of Jesus. Some did not receive Him while others did. To those who did receive Him, they were given the right to become children of God. Why do you think some people reject Jesus? What does it mean to you to be a child of God? How have you experienced this?
- 3. Again, the central verse in this passage is John 1:14: "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen His glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth." One of the names and titles of Jesus is "The Word." This means that Jesus is God's spoken word and when Jesus speaks, it is the same as hearing God's voice. How is your view of God shaped by the words of Jesus? Is there anything that Jesus said that challenges your view of God?
- 4. Two words are featured in this passage that reveal the nature and character of God. The first is *grace*. We see *grace* in verse 14 and in verses 16-17. A good definition of *grace* is "unmerited favor." In other words, it is receiving something without earning or buying it. Grace must be given in order for it to be received. Grace is a free gift, but when received and understood, carries a weighty response. What has been your experience with God's grace? In what ways is grace a mystery?
- 5. The second word that is featured is *truth*. We see *truth* in verse 14 and verse 17. Note that God's *grace* and *truth* came **through** Jesus Christ. A good definition of *truth* is "a disclosure, an unveiling, a revealing, etc." In other words, it is showing how things really are. This type of *truth* is objective and is not influenced by opinion or culture. In what ways have your found God's truth to be impactful in your life? Are there areas where you struggle with it? Reflect on how you can better understand God's truth in your life.
- 6. What is one specific point of application from this text you can implement in your life starting today?
