TEACHABLE MOMENTS
LEADERSHIP



Sun, Jan 9, 2022

Mark 10:35-45

Alf Halvorson preaching

Now that Christmas has passed and we are in a New Year, we take up again *Teachable Moments* from Scripture on important topics, before we go full-bore into Lent and Easter.

This weekend, we also ordain and install MDPC Elders and Deacons. What do they need to know to lead well? And what do all Jesus-followers need to know to use our power and positions of influence appropriately? In the news and on social media, it seems we repeatedly see many more negative examples of leadership than positive ones. They get the attention and promotion. Jesus suggests in our passage that the world has a certain way it leads (because of the Fall), and that Jesus' followers are not to follow that unhealthy path. Whoever would be great in His mind and kingdom can follow another, less-traveled path. Let's wrestle with Jesus' words and life regarding leadership.

- 1. Who have been the best leaders in your life? The worst? What qualities were exhibited in each? And where have been *your* blind spots or mistakes in leadership? When have you led well?
- 2. Look briefly at the context of Luke chapter 10 as a whole. Who has been his audience? What questions has Jesus been answering? Or, what has Jesus been teaching or correcting? And to where is Jesus travelling in verses 32-34?
- 3. Read Mark 10:35-45. Why do you think James and John come to Jesus then, on His way to Jerusalem and the cross? What is their need or concern or worry or hope?
- 4. How does Jesus respond to their request in verse 37? How do they respond to His answer and question in verse 38? And how does Jesus answer their response of "we are able" in verses 39-40?
- 5. In verse 41, the other ten disciples show their anger with James and John for their ambitious power play. If you were Jesus, what might you have said or done? What does Jesus say and ultimately do in verses 42-45? What is shocking about His words? Share an example(s) of each of the two kinds of leadership Jesus describes. Do your examples match up well with the examples you gave in question #1?
- 6. I gave some examples of poor leadership in my sermon, and then said we all have chances to lead well based on the place God has put us and the gifts He's given us. When you evaluate your place and gifts (and what others have told you are your gifts of time, talent, and treasure), where or how might God be inviting you to serve in 2022? Or, like Jesus going to Jerusalem, are you called to lead in a new place and in a new and sacrificial way? Finally, in what ways might you nurture a *servant heart*, after the example of Jesus, "who came not to be served but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many"?
