TEACHABLE MOMENTS
FAITH FROM FISHING



Sunday, Jan 16, 2022

Matthew 4:18-22

Rev. Dr. Alf Halvorson preaching

Is this a joke? Is Pastor Alf really going to talk about fishing during his sermon? John Calvin, our spiritual father wrote, "Nature is the theater of the divine." In other words, we can know about and see God's work and leading through that which God has created in our world. Also, at least one-third of the disciples were professional fishermen. They wore Bass Pro hats. Why did Jesus call them in particular? No other profession gets that kind of preference or favoritism. And then there is Jesus' challenge to Peter and Andrew, James and John, "Follow Me, and I will make you fish for people." How can discussing fishing help us grow in our faith and possibly even lead others to become Jesus followers?

- 1. What is your favorite hobby and why? What function does this hobby serve in your life?
- 2. What is your experience with fishing? Did you have a relative or friend who took you fishing? What are your memories around those experiences? Are they positive or negative? I talked about my grandfather's rustic cabin on the Mississippi River in Wisconsin and how a college friend gave me an outlet after I severely injured my left knee playing basketball. Fishing served a connecting role with others at that time; it also served as a solitary endeavor where I could think and listen for God by myself. Is there an activity or activities that serve those purposes in your life? What are they? When do you tend to turn to them? Are they regular disciplines or only sporadic pursuits?
- 3. Jesus spent a lot of time on or around the Sea of Galilee. Some of His most profound teaching or miracles take place there, like Mark 4:35-41, Matt. 14:22-33, and John 21:1-21, just to name a few. Read those passages quickly and ponder: Why do water and fishing play such a prominent role in the life and teaching of Jesus? Of the Gospel?
- 4. Read Matthew 4:18-22. It makes it seem as if Jesus meets them for the first time and calls them to follow out of nowhere. But we know from the other Gospels that these potential disciples had seen Jesus, heard Him teach, and had previous interactions with Him. Still, it is a jarring passage to imagine them leaving one known profession and life and then deciding right there to follow Jesus into another calling. Have you ever sensed God leading you away from something known and familiar to something unknown but exciting and meaningful? What was it? How is that "calling" playing out?
- 5. I talked in my message about three insights regarding faith I learned from walking streams near the Mississippi River with a college friend, fishing for brown and rainbow trout. I've been trying to live those insights out in different ways in the various seasons of my life. Which point spoke the most to you right now? Why? What change might it necessitate in your life or opportunity might it open up if you take it?
- 6. Jesus' challenge to the four disciples at the Sea of Galilee was, "Follow Me, and I will make you fish for people." What fishing skills might you need to apply to your inviting, challenging, or offering Spiritual Food to others that they might be *caught* (in the best sense of that term) by the Spirit and find life and hope in Christ?
