LIFE'S 4 BIG QUESTIONS

What Will My Purpose Be? Ephesians 4:1-7, 11-16 • Rev. Dr. Alf Halvorson

This is the third of four messages on some of the biggest questions of life. The first week we covered the *foundation* question: "On what will I build my life?" Last week we explored the *companionship* question: "With whom will I spend my life?" Today we wrestle with the *purpose* question. Right before Ephesians 4:1-7 and 11-16 (our passages for today), Paul writes, "Now to Him who by the power at work within us *is able to accomplish abundantly far more* than all we can ask or imagine, to Him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever." What might God accomplish through us, above and beyond just existing, consuming, working, procreating, and paying bills? Today's scripture gives us great handles to grasp as we ponder answers.

- 1. If someone were to ask you why you exist, what would you say? How would you answer that big question? Are we just random collections of DNA (accidents) or is there a purpose behind our creation?
- 2. Read Eph. 4:1-2. What does Paul beg his readers to do? What might our "calling" mean and be? And what character attributes in verse 2 should shine through as we answer the call God has on our lives? Which are you good at, with the Spirit's help? Which are still growing edges for you? Might you ask God in prayer to help you grow and develop where you are deficient?
- 3. Ponder verses 3-4. Last week I talked about building from the same blueprint, or playing off of the same sheet music. According to Paul, how are we, in the Body of Christ, united around the same vision and foundation and purpose given to us by the one God?
- 4. Verses 7 and 11 are the primary places where the Gifts of the Spirit are mentioned in the New Testament (along with the teaching on gifts from 1 Corinthians 12:27-31, Romans 12:4-8, and 1 Peter 4:9-11). The idea is that every believer gets at least one gift. Have you ever taken a Spiritual Gifts Inventory to discover your top few gifts from God? We have one at <u>spiritualgifts.mdpc.org</u>. What are your gifts? Have you been putting them into practice or living out your calling in certain ways? Share with the group. How can we help?
- 5. According to verses 12-16, the gifts God gives are not primarily for us alone, but for wider purposes beyond just ourselves. What are some of the purposes listed in those five verses?
- 6. Paul's list of reasons for the gifts in verses 12-16 focuses almost exclusively on the Body of Christ (the church) and the growth of believers. How might gifts like apostle (sent out); evangelist (where you are); assistance and leadership (1 Cor. 12); giving and compassion (Rom. 12); or serving (1 Peter 4) be used not only in the church but in the world—that His Kingdom might come on earth as it is in heaven?
- 7. Where might God be nudging you to connect or reconnect with Christ's body? Or to serve the world because of God's gifting, Christ's love, and the Spirit's empowering?
