SERMONNOTES



A Righteous Suffering

<u>1 Peter 3:8-17</u>

It can be easy to assume a direct link between doing what is right, and experiencing what is comfortable. Somehow, we come to expect that life will go smoothly if we act as God wishes. But Peter knew that in spite of making wise decisions, we might well encounter hardship. If unjust suffering came to Jesus, it can come to all who follow Him. Peter invites Christ-followers to examine our *actions*, our *attitudes* – especially in the face of trouble – and to develop an *apologetic*: what reason would you give for the hope you have in the resurrection of Jesus and the promise of life redeemed and restored?

- 1. Whether you are using these notes before or after hearing the sermon, take a few minutes to read and slowly re-read 1 Peter 3:8-17. Make note of any words or phrases that stand out to you. Which ones make you curious? Which words connect with your life today?
- 2. What actions and attitudes are listed as befitting to a Jesus-follower?
- 3. What reasons does Peter suggest for living this way? What do you find compelling about that way of living? What do you find difficult about it?
- 4. Commentators suggest that Peter utilizes the word "hope" to mean the same thing that Paul means when he utilizes the word "faith". Supposing the commentators are correct, how does this inform your understanding of 1 Peter 3:15?
- 5. When have you (or someone close to you) suffered because of doing what you believed to be right? Taking up 1 Peter 3:8-17 as a lens, how would you describe your surrounding motives and actions? Place the whole situation prayerfully before God, asking God to care for you, and to guide you into deeper comfort and understanding.
- 6. Theologian Tom Wright explained that "Scripture is the bookshelf; tradition is the memory of what people in the house have read and understood (or perhaps misunderstood) from that shelf; and reason is the set of spectacles that people wear in order to make sense of what they read... and experience [refers] to the effect on readers of what they have read...." How might this image be helpful for discussing Question #6, or for understanding your own faith development?
- 7. Share one or more reasons for having hope in Christ and in Christ's resurrection!
