The Books of Ezra & Nehemiah

Getting the Facts

Nehemiah 2:11-20 NRSV

This is the eighth in our fall sermon series on Ezra and Nehemiah. We are trying to learn from how God helped a people sent into exile for their sins, eventually to return home, rebuild their place of worship (and relationship with God), restore the Word as the center of their shared life, and, finally, rebuild the walls so they could live together in peace and safety, protected from enemies. As I said last weekend, I think Nehemiah is one of the greatest leaders in the entire Bible. In this second half of the second chapter of Nehemiah, he models a way to *tackle* a huge problem and get buy-in from others that is both inspiring and reproduceable in our own lives.

- 1. Who have been the best leaders in your life? What made them so helpful? What qualities did they display? Where have you been required to lead? How did that go?
- 2. Read Nehemiah 2:11-20, but focus on verses 11-16 first. When Nehemiah arrives after his two-month journey from Suza to Jerusalem, what does he do? Why do you think he doesn't share his plans until he has inspected the walls/gates at night himself? When is *openness* important? And when is *discretion* (or secrecy) sometimes necessary?
- 3. In my sermon, I shared the danger of ignoring facts. Where have we as a nation or you personally denied what was true around you? What was the result, or did you face the data in time to avoid a disaster?
- 4. In his short but powerful "vision-casting speech" in verses 17-18, how does Nehemiah use these four elements: identification, seriousness of their plight, an appeal to specific action, and a personal testimony?
- 5. In verses 19-20, how do the enemies of the people of God cast dispersion or try to disrupt Nehemiah's plans? Are they telling the truth or lying? Nehemiah could have ignored them or debated them or fought them right then and there. What approach does he take? Why do you think he took that avenue at that time? How might you know what *tack* to take when you face opposition? And where is God in all this?
- 6. What leadership lessons do you take away from this section of Scripture? How might you apply them to your own faith and life regarding some nagging problem you face?




