# **SERMON**NOTES

The Books of Ezra & Nehemiah

## **External Opposition**

Nehemiah 4:1-23 NRSV

This is the eighth in our fall sermon series that tells the story of Ezra and Nehemiah's return to Jerusalem from an extended exile. We first heard about possible opposition to Nehemiah's wall-rebuilding plan in Neh. 2:10, then a second time in Neh. 2:19-20. Now we have two full chapters (4 and 6) devoted to this matter of opposition from the outside. How are Christians supposed to deal with, handle, and, ideally, overcome obstacles or opposition?

- 1. When in your life have you felt like you were swimming upstream or going against the wind/grain or trying to be faithful to God in the face of opposition?
- 2. How can you tell the difference between legitimate correction from others and ungodly opposition? Does Scripture offer any guidance?
- 3. Read Nehemiah 4:1-23. What, according to verse 1, is Sanballat's motivation for his plots? Why, did you think, is he angry? What do he and Tobiah say and do in verses 2-3?
- 4. What is Nehemiah's response in verse 4 and 5? Are you okay with his prayer? I thought Jesus said to "love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you"? This kind of prayer is called *imprecatory*, because it invokes judgment on someone. What does it mean that Nehemiah leaves what to do with his enemies in God's hands?
- 5. In verses 7-23, there is a back and forth between Nehemiah and his opposition with *move* and *counter move*. How did the hostile neighbors threaten? And how did Nehemiah and God's people respond? And how did Nehemiah model faithfulness?
- 6. Read Neh. 6:1-16. The plot thickens. What do the enemies of God propose and how does Nehemiah react? The first strategy seems to be distraction (and likely assassination) and the second strategy seems to be to discredit Nehemiah. How does Nehemiah learn in verse 2 that they intended to do him harm? And how does Nehemiah respond to each evil strategy? What do verses 15-16 report? Why is keeping close to God so critical?
- 7. What do you learn about handling opposition from Nehemiah? Can it be a vehicle God uses to help us grow and persevere and advance God's purposes? How did Jesus (and the early disciples) handle opposition? What can you learn from them?
