SERMONNOTES



Internal Opposition Nehemiah 5:1-13 NRSV

This is the ninth in our fall sermon series on Ezra and Nehemiah. Last week we looked at opposition from the outside; today

we look at opposition from within. It is hard enough to deal with enemies attacking you and the project God has you working on, but it is even more devastating to have the attacks come from within your team or family or people you called friends.

- 1. When have you been attacked or opposed by those close to you? What hurt did you experience? What did you do with it? How (if you did) did you counter the assault or onslaught?
- 2. Read Nehemiah 5:1-13. What were the three or four complaints many of the exiles raised against their fellow Jews in verses 1-5? How are they similar and different?
- 3. In verses 6-11, what does Nehemiah do in response to these charges? Why is it important to go to the officials and nobles in private first, but then to call a great assembly to deal with this publicly, as well?
- 4. What are Nehemiah's two biggest reasons given in verse 9 that the actions of these offenders are wrong and must be corrected? Do you find those reasons odd or compelling? Explain.
- 5. What does Nehemiah propose in verses 10 and 11, and what is the response by the offenders in verse 12? And why do you think Nehemiah chose the extra actions in verses 12 and 13? Did they result in the transgressors following through on their promises?
- 6. Read Neh. 5:14-19. Too many current politicians or public figures propose or rail about some issue, but their own integrity is not intact. Call up some examples over the last few years. How did Nehemiah model what he was asking others to do?
- 7. It seems to me that this challenging time in Israel's life needed "all hands on deck" to sacrifice together for a purpose larger than themselves—rebuilding the walls. Nehemiah was in Jerusalem *to give* not *to get*. That is why the breach by the nobles and officials was so egregious. They took advantage of the situation primarily *to get*. Where might you be called because of your faith in Christ *to give* with little or no concern about *getting*? Because of this chapter of Scripture (Neh. 5), is there any reason you or I need to repent and possibly make something right? Where might we lead more like Nehemiah (but especially more like Jesus, who gave everything for us through His life and death on the cross)?
