Believe in the God Who Loves You

<u>John 3:16-17</u> NRSV

This is the second of our Believe! series for Advent 2022. Advent means arrival. We remember Christ's

first arrival 2,000 years ago to die for the sins of the world, we await His arrival at the end of days to make all things right, and we "prepare Him room" this year so our Christmas might be joyful, worshipful, and purposeful. The text for today might be the most known and mem-

cannot learn anything new from it. However, my experience of Scripture is that it is shallow enough for a child not to drown, but also deep enough for the best swimmers always to find new, refreshing, and deeper water.	
1.	Read John 3:16-17. When was the first time you remember hearing these verses or seeing them? What was the context? And what was your reaction?
2	From John 3:16, where does the <i>initiative</i> lie regarding salvation? Us or God? And what
2.	is the <i>motivation</i> for God's action? And finally, <i>how wide</i> is the love God offers? Is it only narrowly applied or extended or much wider than expected and deserved?
3.	In John 3:17, John tried to correct a possible misunderstanding for Christ's coming. What is the misunderstanding, according to the verse? Why do you think John needed to bring this point up? Why, according to the last half of the verse, did God send the Son?
4.	The second half of John 3:16 invites us to believe. What are we invited to <i>believe in</i> or <i>believe into</i> here? And what might it look like for you to "believe" in the Son this Christmas?
