

Sent Ones

Matthew 27:27-34 Pastor Alf Halvorson Preaching

On the night of the Last Supper, Jesus prays for His disciples in John chapter 17. It is not a bad idea to read the entire prayer, verses 1-26, to get the tone of the encounter with the Father, the flavor of the words, and the context of our text (vs. 15-23).
1. What phrases from Jesus' prayer in John chapter 17 hit you? What subjects does He cover? What does He ask the Father to do? What does that reveal about Jesus' heart?
2. In verses 15-18, Jesus determines not to ask the Father to take the disciples out of the world. What does He specifically pray? How can they find and know the truth?
3. In verse 18, Jesus admits that the Father sent Him ("apostled" Him in Greek) into the world. And Jesus admits that He has "sent" the disciples into the world. In fact, in case we missed it, John 20:19-21 reminds us that when Jesus appeared to the disciples after the Resurrection, showing them His hands and His side, He said again, "As the Father has sent Me, so I send you." Where did the Father send Jesus? What was He supposed to do? Whom did He interact with during His three years of ministry? What did He teach?

4. If we are to be followers of Jesus, and Jesus has sent us into the world, what do you think that means for you individually? What about for MDPC?

5.	How do verses 19-23 flesh out how we are to be sent? Does oneness mean sameness? Explain Where is it important to be in sync, or one? Where is unity essential? Where is it okay to be different? What are the non-essentials, where it can be okay that we differ?
6.	I shared a few examples of believers being sent. One example was to the faraway place of Malawi. The rest of the places were local. Share if you have been sent internationally for Christ. Where are one or two local places where Christ might send you?
7.	I talked about "third places." Your <i>first place</i> is your home, <i>second place</i> is your work, and a <i>third place</i> is where people relax or do things together: coffee shops, community centers, gyms, grocery stores, beauty parlors, the golf course, a park, dance studio, etc. Do you have a third place? What might it look like for you to be a "sent one" there?
8.	If you are struggling right now with "what to say when you pray," what if you looked once again at John 17:6-26 and prayed some of the key themes and key words that Jesus prayed? Translate them to your situation and our world today. It is hard to go wrong when you imitate the Master
