

DIGGING DEEPER



You Will Be My Disciples If...

John 13:33-35; Exodus 17:1-7 Pastor Alf Halvorson Preaching

Last week, Jesus (in John 17:18 and 20:21) tells the disciples, "As the Father has sent Me, so I send you." We are all *sent ones, apostles, missionaries.* Some go far away and many do their missionary work in "third places" close to home. Jesus prays for oneness because of the love the Father and Son and disciples share, and also because they are sanctified in the word (John 17:17-23).

This week, we need to flesh out what the love of God looks like between believers. Jesus, on the same night that He prayed to the Father about love and oneness and being sent, also gave the disciples a new commandment in John 13:33-35. He had to give this command because in the world, even among believers, the opposite is often demonstrated.

1. Read Exodus 17:1-7. The People of God had been freed from Egypt. God helped them miraculously, but the people were not satisfied or happy. With whom did they quarrel? Why? What did Moses do? How did God respond?

2. Was God with them or not (vs. 7)? Is division or dissension a byproduct of feeling that God is not among us? Yes or No. Explain your position from Exodus 17:1-7 or other texts.

3. What are other reasons for division and quarreling? Where do you see bickering and feuding in your family, neighborhood, the world, and in the church?

4. Jesus gives the new commandment to *love one another* in John 13:33-35. He says, "Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another." How has Jesus loved them? What did His love look like? What shape did it take?

5. Jesus goes on to say in verse 35, "By this everyone will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another." Why does He use the word "if"? What choices do we have?

6. Jesus also seems to suggest in verse 35 that the defining characteristic of being His disciple is love. In other words, our love for each other lets the world know that we are disciples of Jesus. What happens when Christians aren't loving toward each other? How might our witness to Christ suffer?

7. If people know about Jesus through you, what are they seeing or learning about Jesus from your life and relationships?

8. As we go through Denominational Discernment, I am not suggesting that people not have strongly held positions. But, according to Jesus, our posture of love might be just as important (or maybe even more important) than our positions. Do you agree or disagree? Over the door at the YMCA in Jerusalem is the statement: "In the essential, unity; in the non-essentials, liberty; and in all things, charity [love]." Can you/we commit to that during our time of Discernment?
