

QUESTIONS Why Are You So Afraid? God Asks Of Us • — Matthew 8:23-27 Martha Moore Preaching

Everyone loves an invitation, and in this week's Scripture passage there are at least three: to cross to the other side, to be like Jesus, and to engage in authentic conversation. Reread Mark 4:35-41 and then engage in the following questions.

- 1. Tell about a storm that you personally experienced. What was it like? What emotions did you experience? How were you changed after the storm was over?
- 2. What's appealing about the *zoe* (full, rich, abundant) life? What keeps you from living this life?
- 3. The disciples take the initiative when Jesus extends the invitation to cross over to the other side by inviting Jesus into their boat. What initiatives have you taken in your faith?
- 4. Where are you hearing Jesus invite you to go even further in your faith? How do you plan to take the initiative in this next invitation? What's holding you back?
- 5. Is there a part of your life where Jesus is not invited? A relationship? Your job? School? A certain habit or hobby? An attitude? What would it look like for Jesus to become a part of this area of your life? Every area of your life?
- 6. The disciples didn't ask Jesus to calm the storm, but instead asked if He even cared that they were perishing. Why, in their panic stricken state of mind, would they ask this question?
- 7. Share a time when you felt like God didn't care about a storm you were experiencing. Describe how later you realized He was actually at work in your life.
- 8. Do you engage in authentic conversation with God about why you are so afraid? In what ways? If not, why not?
- 9. Jesus invites us to be like Him by experiencing peace even in the middle of life's storms by completely trusting in our Father's care. What storm are you currently facing? What steps will you take to experience what St. Augustine calls Perpetual Sabbath: "There we shall rest and see, see and love, love and praise. This is what shall be in the end without end. For what other end do we propose to ourselves than to attain to the kingdom of which there is no end?" (City of God, St. Augustine, book 22, chapter 30)
- 10. Commit this week to one or more of the following challenges:
 - \cdot Invite one person this week to lunch, to MDPC, to your small group, to experience life on other side.
 - · Live this week in Psalm 23.
 - · Engage in deep conversation with Jesus when fear creeps in. Be ready to share with the group next week about your experience.
