Mix and mingle with other young adults over breakfast tacos and coffee. No matter what service you choose for worship, this is a space for anyone college-thru-40ish to hang out.





QUESTIONS Who Is My Mother? Brother? Sister? Mark 3:31-35 Dan Aikins Preaching

Jesus responds to His searching family with a phrase that seems dismissive of His earthly family. Why would Jesus be so brisk, maybe even a little rude, to His family who is simply looking for Him? When we search the Scriptures a little deeper, we realize that Jesus' family had some ulterior motives in there for Him.

Instead of a rude Jesus, we find in this passage a Jesus who is singularly focused on doing God's will and whose earthly family is inadvertently impeding that great purpose. Two thousand years later, we read Jesus' words to His family and encounter both a challenge to our own assumptions and a grace-filled invitation to enter into Jesus' family.

- 1. What was your first reaction to how Jesus responds to His family? Did Jesus' reaction seem rude and dismissive? Appropriate and on target? Or did it strike you in some other way entirely?
- 2. To understand this passage, it is important to understand what Jesus means by *the will of God*. Mark's Gospel defines God's will in a particular way. What is Mark's definition? (Hint: Look to Jesus' first words in the Gospel.)
- In your own words, describe how Jesus' response to His family challenges our own assumptions and definition of the Gospel or good news of God.
- 4. How would you define the Gospel? What are some aspects of the Gospel that you emphasize in your own faith, and what may be some of your blind spots?
- 5. How do Jesus' words to His family offer an implicit invitation to become members of Jesus' family?
- 6. How might Jesus' definition of His family affect our relationships with other churchgoers at MDPC? How might it affect our relationships with other Christians around Houston and the globe?
- 7. As we at MDPC continue to move through life-after-discernment, how ought we to apply this passage in our interactions with each other? How could Jesus' words affect our attitudes and dispositions toward one another?
