DIGGING DEEPER



don't know if I have ever been more excited about a sermon series than the one we are beginning today. We have the privilege to ponder and then diligently attempt to apply Jesus' only recorded sermon in the Four Gospels. The first two verses of Matthew chapter 5, in Eugene

Peterson's *The Message* paraphrase, set up His teaching this way: "When Jesus saw His ministry

drawing huge crowds, *He climbed* a hillside. Those who were apprenticed to Him, the committed, *climbed with Him*. Arriving at a quiet place, He sat down and taught *His climbing companions*."

- 1. Have you ever heard a disciple of Jesus referred to as a "climbing companion"? Have you ever thought that Jesus wants to take you individually and as a community to "higher ground"? What does this idea stir up in you? Fear? Excitement? Hope? Something else? Explain...
- 2. Verses 3-11 contain the famous Beatitudes. There are nine of them. I tried to explain briefly what each phrase means from the Greek. I started, however, with the word "blessed," or "happy," and suggested that Jesus probably took the idea from Psalm 1. He will create a parable much like the one in Psalm 1 at the end of the Sermon on the Mount (Matt. 7:24-27), but He suggests that we are "blessed" or "on the right path" when we are and do what?
- 3. It is interesting to me that the first four Beatitudes are about "being in trouble." Namely, they deal with our needing help or being insufficient without God. They are receiving postures. However, the last five Beatitudes are more about "doing things for others—or what others might do to us." What do you make of those different focuses by Jesus? Does the ordering matter? Why or why not? And which Beatitude is most natural and unnatural for you?
- 4. Describe the various forms persecution can take. Why are people persecuted for doing the right thing? Share a real example of this from your life, either as persecutor or persecuted.
- 5. I used an example from the book *Decisive* by Chip and Dan Heath regarding the 1970s and 80s rock star David Lee Roth. He developed a way to find out if the set-up crews at each venue had done all the work needed to prepare for his arrival. He used M&Ms as a tripwire to prevent disaster, to find out if they were on the right path. How are these nine Beatitudes like tripwires to remind us of the path Christ walked and wants us to walk?
- 6. Then I told a family story about the Halvorson's Adventure hiking the Grand Canyon from rim to rim three years ago. What parallels to hiking does following Jesus have? Where does the image break down?
- 7. Are you, as Eugene Peterson's *The Message* paraphrase puts it, one of Christ's "climbing companions"? How are you personally, this fall, getting on the right path? What does it mean that Jesus is the Way/the Path? What prayer needs to be prayed? What group of climbers do you need to join? What additional training do you need to do or skill do you need to develop? What merciful act or peacemaking move do you need to take today?
