

Jesus' Sermon on the Mount

Matthew 5:13-20

Pastor Alf Halvorson Preaching

This is the second in a series of messages on Jesus' Sermon on the
Mount. Last week we looked at the 9
Beatitudes, or Blessings, or "You're on the right path if"s. Right from the beginning of His sermon, Jesus was clear to reveal what life looks like when God is in control, when the Kingdom of heaven comes down to earth, when disciples/apprentices/climbing companions

of Jesus embrace and then display Christ's love and life. Jesus was such an outstanding preacher that He offered two illustrations, two visual aids, two pictures to bring His initial 9 points home.

- 1. In verses 13-16 of Matthew chapter 5, what two illustrations does Jesus use? If you were summarizing verses 1-12, what images might you use and why?
- 2. I shared that there were at least two uses of salt in the ancient world. What were they? How might Christians be both of those things? And what might be an example of salt "losing its taste"?
- 3. Jesus makes a point that "you are the salt of the *earth*." And, "you are the light of the *world*." Why didn't Jesus just say that we are to be salt and light of the church? Why the *world* specifically? How in general do you think Christians do in that regard? And how about MDPC specifically?
- 4. We are to be light, and light which is not hidden. How do Christians hide the light of Christ? How have you hidden your light? Where might Christ be asking you to be salt or light?
- 5. To Jesus, verses 17-20 are a natural extension of His illustrations regarding salt and light. How is that so in your mind? Psalm 119:11 and 105 might provide a clue...
- 6. The Message paraphrase translates verses 19-20 this way: "Trivialize even the smallest item in God's law and you will only have trivialized yourself. But take it seriously, show the way for others, and you will find honor in the kingdom. Unless you do far better than the Pharisees in the matters of right living, you won't know the first thing about entering the kingdom." How is God's Word salt and light to you?
- 7. I love the quote from Mark Twain that says, "The parts of the Bible which bother me the most are not the parts I don't understand, but the parts I do. Because then I am challenged to put the parts I understand into practice." Jesus seems to be suggesting that the Scribes and Pharisees were great with "talk," but not so good with their "walk." What specific step will you take this week to apply some aspect of Matthew 5:1-20? Write it down on a card; keep it in your pocket or on your fridge or dashboard. Pray for an outlet. Celebrate when you "walk it out."
