

The reality is that almost half of high school students struggle deeply with their faith in college. In response to this problem, Fuller Youth Institute conducted a national study to determine: What can we do to help students develop a lasting faith in God? Jesus' Sermon on the Mount

Matthew 6:19-34
Pastor Alf Halvorson Preaching

This is the eighth in our series on Jesus'
Sermon on the Mount. We don't have
to take a break from the series to cover
our Generosity Conversation. Right at
this point of the Sermon, Jesus talks again
about "money and what our approach
to it might be." Remember He first talked
about "when you give alms" (money to the

poor) in verses 2-3 of chapter 6. Now He comes back around to address the topic more completely.

- 1. Years ago, one of the world's richest men, John D. Rockefeller, was asked, "How much is enough?" He famously answered, "Just a little bit more." Is he right? What does Jesus say in verses 19-21?
- 2. Jesus is really talking about *permanence*. Where does Jesus say our money is safe and secure? And how does He connect that to our "hearts"? Explain.
- 3. In verses 22-24, Jesus talks about *priorities*, to be careful what our eyes get drawn to in this life. How does what our eyes focus on determine who our master is?
- 4. In verses 25-34, Jesus talks about living by fear or faith. Here, worry is tied to lack of faith. Jesus wants to liberate us from obsessing with what we drink, what we wear, what we eat. What is His advice? How does He suggest we *plan* differently than the Gentiles?
- 5. Are you a worrier? How does worry show up in your life? What is the antidote to worry, according to Jesus?
- 6. Verse 33 seems to be the key for this entire section. Jesus says, "But strive first for the Kingdom of God." Run after it, and seek it as most important. You've seen the illustration of putting sand into a jar, then trying to put in a few big rocks *last*—there is not enough room. However, if you put the big rocks in *first*, the sand will all fit, too. How can you make sure you "seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness" this week?
- 7. Looking at this whole section (verses 19-34), how might your 2017 financial pledge to MDPC help you invest in that which is permanent, get your priorities right (and thus your heart invested right), and help you plan for *faithful* instead of *fearful* living?
