Jesus' Sermon on the Mount

Matthew 7:13-23

Pastor Alf Halvorson Preaching

This is the tenth in our series on Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. Martin Luther says of Matthew 7:13-23, "Our Lord has stopped preaching and closes His time off with several warnings." Jesus is tough here as opposed to tender.

- 1. What is the first warning, as recorded in verses 13 and 14?
- 2. How does John 10:1-10 help you know what (or who) the gate is? Why is the Jesusway the narrow-way? One of the greatest of virtues, as our society sees it, is to be broad-minded. To doubt this is to be intolerant. Jesus offers a different teaching. Is He right or is the world right? Explain and defend your answer with examples.
- 3. In verses 15-20, what is the second warning? Why is talk cheap? Why is someone's *walk* more of a true indicator of the person than *talk* alone? What fruit(s) might you look for in a person's life or an organization's life to determine its faithfulness and effectiveness?
- 4. One theologian has written, "Good works do not make a person good, but a good person does good works." In other words, we aren't saved by works but by grace; once saved by Christ, we offer our works in gratitude to God for saving us. It is the difference between justification and sanctification. Discuss these concepts...
- 5. In verses 21-23, Jesus offers a third warning. What is it? How is it similar and different from the previous two warnings?
- 6. Jesus talks about two gates, two kinds of trees, two doers, and ultimately, in verses 24-27, two houses. He is setting up a series of choices for all of us, between a series of two alternatives. Jesus suggests that after a commitment to Christ, we must make some real and, at times, painful and difficult choices to be Kingdom-people. We can't stay at the fork in the road and never choose. And our choices matter, regarding joy, fruit, and our futures. What choices has God placed before you right now? Do you need any more information? Prayer? To project out what each path would produce in a year or a lifetime? Decide today; don't delay!
- 7. November 6th is Covenant Sunday at MDPC. It is when those who call MDPC home make an anonymous financial pledge to God for the coming year. How has Jesus' Sermon on the Mount helped you understand better how to use your time, and talents, and treasure for God's glory? If you have not made a pledge in the past, why not make one this year? And if you have pledged in the past, what is God calling you to give this year in response to how you have been blessed?
