Jesus' Sermon on the Mount

Matthew 7:24-27

Pastor Alf Halvorson Preaching

There are some great questions to ask people about Scripture. For instance, Who is your favorite character and why? Which is your favorite Old Testament and New Testament book? If you had to choose one passage as your all-time favorite, what would it be and why? For me, the answer to the last question very well might be Matthew

7:24-27. In this parable, Jesus summarizes everything He has said in the previous two chapters of His most famous sermon with a clear and memorable word-picture. To me, this ranks right up there with the Parable of the Prodigal Son and the Story of the Good Samaritan.

- 1. This is a two-picture parable. I remember a professor in seminary saying, "When you get a two-picture parable like this, Jesus wants us to look for similarities and differences. That is the key to interpretation." So:
  - What is the same here between the house built on rock and the house built on sand?
  - What then is the great variable in this parable? What is different in these two pictures—these two houses?
- 2. Talk about foundations. What is significant about these hidden, out-of-sight bases?
- 3. I talked about all places having challenges, like hurricanes or tornadoes or flooding or heat or cold. What is the good and bad about Houston? If you could choose anywhere to live, where would it be and why?
- 4. I suggested that all of us experience the "storms" of life. We don't all get hit with the same-force winds, but what are some of the storms you have survived? Is there a storm you are facing personally right now? How might we pray for you?
- 5. My closing story or illustration was about the Golden Gate Bridge. I said, "It is totally preoccupied with its foundation." Talk to your group about *your* foundation.
- 6. From verse 24 of Matthew 7, what specific aspect of Jesus' Sermon do you need to *hear* and *do* so that your foundation is firm(er)? This week, how will you "walk it out"?
