



This is the second in a four-part series on Jesus' Temptations in the Wilderness at the beginning of His ministry. This second temptation in verses 5-7 is full of *holy* things. The devil took Jesus to the *holy* city, placed Him on top of the *holy* temple, and

quoted from *Holy* Scriptures. Dale Bruner says, "Where the first temptation smelled like a bakery, the second has the aroma of a Greek Orthodox Church at Easter." The first temptation tried to reach Jesus through a weak spot, His stomach. The devil now tries to reach Jesus through his strong spot, his trust in God's Word. It is easiest to get us where we are weakest; next easiest to get us where we are strongest.

- 1. In verses 5 and 6, what does the devil actually do and say?
- 2. Jesus quoted Scripture in verse 4 to dismiss temptation one. What does it mean to you that the devil quotes Scripture (Psalm 91:11-12) in his second temptation in verse 6? Have you ever thought that the devil knows the Bible? The devil doesn't walk out Scripture faithfully, but he is familiar with its promises and commands.
- 3. It's almost as if the tempter is saying to Jesus, "You quoted Scripture before. Put Your money where Your mouth is. You believe in the Word of God? Then step out on it." Why is that such a devious and subtle temptation? Read Psalm 91. Does it really tell us to throw ourselves off a building to prove that God will catch us?
- 4. In verse 7, Jesus says, "Again it is written" or "It is written in another place." Then He quotes Deuteronomy 6:16: "Do not put the Lord your God to the test." What is Jesus showing us here? What does He mean? What can we learn from this example?
- 5. Is one Scripture right and the other wrong? Or are both right under certain circumstances? How do you determine when a Scripture applies to your situation and when it doesn't?
- 6. The devil uses a Scripture for when we are under duress to trust God's promise of care and help. Was Jesus really under duress? Jesus uses a Scripture that teaches reverent caution before God's holiness. Why is Jesus correct here? How has the devil misapplied his verse?
- 7. If Jesus threw Himself down right there and right then as the devil tempted Him to do, then He/we become the tester of God. We tell God how, when, and where God is supposed to fulfill God's promise from Psalm 91. Putting God to the test reverses our relationship to God. We are in charge, and God is our servant—at our beck and call when we order. Why is that not okay?
- 8. Where are you tempted to use God as simply "a means to your ends"? Or to try to force God's good ends when not needed or in your timeframe? Do you (do I) follow God, or must God follow us?
