




Lenten Podcasts: Testimonies of Faith

DIGGING DEEPER



This is the third in a series of messages on The Temptations of Jesus in the wilderness at the beginning of His ministry.

In the first temptation, the devil meets Jesus where He is, in the wilderness. In the second temptation, the devil takes

Him to the pinnacle of the temple. Now, in the third temptation, the devil takes Jesus higher still...

- 1. Read Matthew 23:11-12. How do the temptations physically play out this principle of God?
- 2. In verse 8 of Matthew 4, the devil takes Jesus to a very high mountain and shows Him all the kingdoms of the world and their splendor. In verse 9, what does the devil offer Jesus? Does the devil have the authority to offer these things? Read John 12:30-32, 14:30-31, and 16:11; 2 Corinthians 4:4-6; and Ephesians 2:1-9. Discuss.
- 3. Because of our sin, the scriptures above teach that the devil has power over this world for a time and in a "boundaried" sort of way. So the temptation offered to Jesus is real: The devil *can* deliver the world to Him for a time. And Jesus came to the world because of His love for the world. Jesus came to secure the salvation of the world. What do you think is at work in this third temptation of Jesus?
- 4. For you, what is the fundamental problem with the devil's request in verse 9? Do you think the devil really would have given Jesus the world if He had bowed down, or was the devil lying?
- 5. What is Jesus' response in verse 10? He quotes Deuteronomy 6:13. What do you think is the significance of the short phrase "only Him"? The word "only (or "alone") also is used in verse 4. Why does that matter here?
- 6. It seems to me that one way to look at this temptation is as the devil offering Jesus the goal He wants, but through a means that goes against Jesus' beliefs and the teaching of Scripture. Do the ends justify the means? Where have you been tempted to worship the wrong thing to get the right thing; to use the wrong means for a right end?
- 7. Where, right now, is this temptation real and challenging for you? As each member of the group shares their genuine struggle, pray for each other—right then and there. Offer other support as needed.
