DIGGING DEEPER



This is the second in a short series in the New Year on *Spiritual Gifts*, playing off my Vision Sermon to start 2017. I hope many of you were able to take the brief but important Gift Inventory at spiritualgifts.mdpc.org. Every Christian is given at least one spiritual gift for the common good, for building up the body of Christ, and for experiencing joy and purpose (working side by side with God) with your one and only life. The question becomes, "What will you and I do with the gifts God has given us?" Jesus tells a parable near the end of His life that serves as both a

warning and a positive challenge to His followers.

- 1. Read the whole parable, Matthew 25:14-30. Initially, what happens to the master? In other words, where does he go and for how long (see verses 14-15, 19)? Have you ever felt like God was far away and that you were on your own? C.S. Lewis said in The Screwtape Letters that God props up the beginning believer with feelings and crutches for a while, but, as he or she matures in faith, God often removes the supports to see if we will follow even without the feelings or extra helps. Describe a time when you have felt "supported" and when you have felt "alone in your faith."
- 2. Does it bother you that one person got 5 talents, another 2, and another 1? Explain your answer. I shared that 1 talent equaled about 15 years' wages. Does that knowledge help your answer above or not?
- 3. In verses 16-18, describe what each servant did or did not do.
- 4. In verse 19, the text says that the master returned and settled accounts with them. What does it mean to you that Jesus says there will be "an accounting" for all of us? Does that generate comfort, fear, hope, closure...?
- 5. Reflect on verses 20-30. What is identical, and what is different in the three scenarios?
- 6. The 1-talent man had a particular view of God. What do verses 24-25 say? Was his view correct? How did his view influence his actions? And how did the master respond to him?
- 7. Is the master mean in verses 28-30? What about the axiom, "Use it or lose it"? One way to read this part of the story is that the master took a talent that was put on a shelf and gave it to someone who would put it in the game. How do you see it?
- 8. Where and how does this parable of Jesus speak to you? How might your spiritual giftedness dovetail with our potential 12 priorities/goals, which ideally will be approved at this weekend's leadership retreat?
