## Miriam & Pharaoh's Daughter

Exodus 2:1-10 Rick Myers preaching

ur summer Sermon Series continues with the story of Moses' birth and his miraculous rescue. The Supporting Characters in our passage for this morning are Miriam (the sister of Moses) and Pharaoh's daughter. The Hebrew people knew the stories of Joseph and Jacob and how they'd settled in Egypt four centuries ago. But that was then, and now they were slaves under

the rule of the Egyptians. Some might have thought it was 430 years too late, yet God's plan for deliverance was right on schedule. His servant Moses was born during the rule of

a tyrannical Pharaoh whose infanticide program was aimed at annihilating the nation of Israel. Ironically, baby Moses was delivered from danger when Pharaoh's daughter rescued him from the Nile. Then, Miriam talked her into hiring Moses' mother to nurse him, and raise him as a royal son.

Little did the participants know that the story of God's people had just begun. The details of Moses' rescue form an outline of the big picture found in the New Testament story of Jesus. God delivered His people from bondage in Egypt as a preview of the deliverance that Christ would eventually bring to us. It would be centuries before Jesus would come as God's perfect Passover Lamb and secure deliverance for His people. Yet the blood of the Passover foreshadows what was to come when the Lamb of God set foot on the stage of history.

The main point of the amazing story of Moses' birth and rescue is this: God always has a plan, and He can use anybody to carry it out - even Moses' sister and Pharaoh's own daughter! God can use anyone to carry out His plan - even you! It's what the Israelites needed to know as they wandered in the wilderness for 40 years, and it's what you and I need to be reminded of every day as we wander in the wilderness of our lives.

## **QUESTIONS TO THINK ABOUT:**

- 1. What were Pharaoh's original plans for the life of Moses? What do we know about God's eventual plan for Moses? Who were some of the people and what were some circumstances God used to make sure His plans would succeed and Pharaoh's did not?
- 2. What are some examples of times you've needed protection?
- 3. Who did God use to protect you?
- 4. Was there anything that Moses could have done to save himself from all the danger around him?
- 5. Have you learned to trust God with His plan for your life?

Our passage for today is about God protecting a helpless little baby. What an amazing story of a sister and mother's love for Moses. We all know how Moses grew to be one of the greatest leaders the people of Israel has ever known. And it all started with a little baby hidden in the bulrushes down by the river. God used Miriam and Pharaoh's daughter, and God can use you to make a difference in the world. Trust God's plan for your life!
