The Woman Who Touched Jesus' Robe Matt. 9:20–22, Mark 5:25–34, Luke 8:43–48 Message by Martha Moore This Sunday's *Supporting Character* is the woman who has been bleeding for 12 years. By order of Levitical law (see Leviticus 15), she is considered unclean and not allowed to touch or be touched by anyone. She is desperate and sees the opportunity to be healed when Jesus, along with a large crowd, walks through her town as He is on His way to heal Jairus' daughter. Please read all three accounts to get the whole story.

- 1. Read aloud Matthew 9:20-22, Mark 5:25-34, and Luke 8:43-48. Have someone in the group retell the story using everyday language.
- 2. What are some of the repeated words used throughout all the accounts. What powerful images do they convey?
- 3. Has there been a time in your life when you felt misunderstood and cut off from the community? What was that experience like for you?
- 4. In the sermon we learned that perhaps the woman had reached out and touched the fringe of Jesus' garment because she had faith in a promise made in Malachi 4:2 and because perhaps she remembered some powerful Old Testament stories involving the fringe of someone's garment (see 1 Samuel 24, Ruth 3, 1 Kings 19:19-21, 2 Kings 2:12-14). Share with the group a promise or a Bible story that God has given you. Has that promise been fulfilled or are you still waiting in faith for God's provision? How do you stay faithful for what you have not yet experienced?
- 5. What if she hadn't been healed, do you think she would have continued to pursue Jesus, to be faithful to Him?
- 6. Will we stay faithful in our love for God even if we don't receive what we want? What would staying faithful look like?
- 7. In this account, Jesus listened to the woman as she told the "whole truth" about how she had been healed. What are ways you sense that God hears you when you share your life with Him?
- 8. David Ausberger says, "Being heard is so close to being loved that, for the average person, they are almost indistinguishable." Talk about a time when you felt truly heard.
- 9. In the sermon, we were encouraged to discern those who need us to hear their stories. What names came to mind? When will you reach out to those people who need to be heard?
