WRESTLING WITH SCRIPTURE



God of Judgment or God of Love?

Joshua 6:20-21; 2 Samuel 6:3-7; John 3:16-17; Psalm 103:10-12; Luke 13:1-5 | Clay Brown preaching

This is the third in our summer series on the tough texts and topics of Scripture with which we wrestle. It's even more of a doozie than last week! What about the differences between the Old Testament God and the New Testament God? The God of judgment versus the God of love? Are we even talking about the same God? What is going on?

- 1. Read Joshua 6:20-21 and 2 Samuel 6:3-7. Both passages refer to events that bother us greatly and leave us wondering, *Why would God either command or do such a thing?* What similar events in the Old Testament cause us spiritual heartburn?
- 2. Now read John 3:16-17. Paraphrase what these two familiar verses are saying. Please note how different in tone and tenor this communication about God's purpose and action sounds than what we referenced above. What may account for the difference?
- 3. Some people believe that the God of the Old Testament is not only a different God than the God of the New Testament, but that the Old Testament God is evil, vengeful, and capricious. The sermon quotes two luminaries who have made this point in different ways: Gary Larson (through humor) and Richard Dawkins (through invective). What are valid and helpful Christian responses to such viewpoints?
- 4. As the sermon unfolds, it brings out additional Scriptural texts showing that God's love is present in the Old Testament (Psalm 103:10-12) and His judgment is present in the New Testament (Luke 13:1-5). What is your response to discovering this more well-rounded understanding of God's character and nature? How does this change or affect your response to questions #1 and #2 above?
- 5. The sermon seeks to make the point that God's justice, as revealed through His judgment, and God's grace, as revealed through His love, are both essential to His holiness. What happens if God's justice is missing from the equation? God's grace? How do both judgment and love, when combined together, reveal God's transcendence and purity?
- 6. Can we trust a God who is just but not loving? Can we trust a God who is loving but not just? Why is the God revealed through both Old and New Testaments worthy of our trust and commitment?
