WRESTLING WITH SCRIPTURE



Following Christ: A Cross or a Cushion?

Matthew 11:28-30 (NRSV & The Message); Luke 9:23-24 (NRSV) | Beth Case preaching

This is the fourth in our summer series on the tough texts and topics of Scripture with which we wrestle. Jesus said, *take up your cross daily, and follow Me* (Lk 9:23). Jesus also said, *Come to Me...and you will find rest for your souls* (Mt 11:28-29). What did Jesus have in mind when He called us to follow Him? And what are we to do when two ideas, both spoken by our Lord, seem contradictory?

- 1. Many people employ the phrase, "this is the cross I must bear" when referring to a troublesome relationship, a thankless job, a physical illness, or a disability. Is this an accurate understanding of the phrase? Before Jesus died, what did people think when they heard about a cross?
- 2. In addition to a cross, the sermon names another object common to the people of Jesus' day. What did the image of a yoke bring to the minds of 1st-century people?
- 3. Read Matthew 11:20-12:8. To whom is Jesus speaking in Matthew 11:28-30? Why did Jesus choose this particular setting to speak of rest for the soul? (Extra Credit: Read Hebrews 4:1-13 and note what it says about rest for the soul.)
- 4. Read Luke 9:18-26. Put this story in your own words. What language does Jesus use to talk about His own life? How does Jesus speak about the lives of those who follow Him?
- 5. Is there danger in ordering your walk with Jesus by only one of these statements: 1) *take up your cross*; OR 2) *My yoke is easy*?
- 6. Billy Graham once said, "I'm counting totally and completely on the Lord Jesus Christ, and not on Billy Graham. I'm not going to Heaven because I've read the Bible, nor because I've preached to a lot of people. I'm going to Heaven because of what Christ did." How might Graham's words be "taking up one's cross," while also being "yoked" with Jesus?
- 7. Presbyterian pastor, Eugene Peterson, wrote The Message, in hope of connecting readers to the meaning of words and the relevance of God's Word. How does his paraphrase of Matthew 11:28-30 meet that goal? Are you tired? Worn out? Burned out on religion? Come to me. Get away with me and you'll recover your life. I'll show you how to take a real rest. Walk with me and work with me—watch how I do it. Learn the unforced rhythms of grace. I won't lay anything heavy or ill-fitting on you. Keep company with me and you'll learn to live freely and lightly.
- 8. In what seasons of life has your faith called you to deny your self? In what seasons has your faith leaned toward legalism? In what seasons of life have you experienced the rest of relationship with God?
