



Alpha Runs Here.

IN COMMUNITY • HEBREWS 10:24-25 SENIOR PASTOR ALF HALVORSON PREACHING

This is the second in our *All In* sermon series. Last week we focused on what *treasuring* means and what Dumbledore meant when he said to Harry Potter in *The Chamber of Secrets*, "It is not our abilities that show what we truly are. It is our choices." The choices we make; the habits we establish and keep; the disciplines we commit to – these things reveal what we treasure and determine who we will

become. Do your current habits reveal that you know you are treasured by God? That you are *All In* for following Jesus in and through MDPC?

According to the writer of the Book of Hebrews, one key choice (that not all believers choose to make or follow) is recorded in Hebrews 10:24-25. Read that short passage, perhaps adding verses 10:19-25 for greater context.

- 1. FIRST HABIT TO NURTURE (vs. 25) "Do not neglect to meet together, as is the habit of some." What do you think "meet together" means, especially in the context of verses 19-23? Does it include worship? Small groups? Prayer? Service together? One? Some? All? Why or why not?
- 2. I tried to make the case, early on in my sermon, that Americans have a hard time with community because of our rugged individualism and consumerism. I quoted Larry Rasmussen and Alexis de Tocqueville to try to make that point. Do you agree or disagree? Give examples from current life to support your contention.
- 3. I even made the case that it is not, "I think, therefore, I am;" nor is it, "I do, therefore, I am." I contended it is, "I love, therefore, I am." React to that idea.
- 4. SECOND HABIT TO NURTURE (vs. 24) "Consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds." The Greek for the word *provoke* is to "stir up, irritate, contend with, hold accountable." Have you given anyone in your life permission to provoke you to love and good deeds? I talked about a doctor friend in Ames, Iowa, that members of a small group confronted, and about a Lazarus Group in Springfield, Missouri, that tried to help unwrap people Christ had raised from the dead spiritually, but who were still bound or had physical or emotional wounds. How can you prepare yourself to be on the receiving and giving sides of that equation, because of Christ?
- 5. THIRD HABIT TO NURTURE (vs. 25b) "Encourage one another, especially as you see the day approaching." I talked about Dietrich Bonhoeffer, who contends in his little book, *Life Together*, that, in Christ, we never approach anyone directly anymore, but only through the filter of Jesus. Once we become Christian, every relationship is mediated through the blood and spirit of Christ. That allows us to encourage (to fill with courage or strength of purpose) with Christ's love, to forgive with Christ's forgiveness, and to stay committed to each other, even in the midst of normal disappointment and sins—because we have Christ's endurance and eternal perspective. Who might God be inviting you to allow into your life to provoke or encourage you? If you don't have a group where this type of relational authenticity and vulnerability is present, how might you find, create, or fight for it?
- 6. I ended my sermon with the statement: "Connect or die." Was I being overly dramatic? Or truthful on a fundamental level? This kind of "going deeper with one another" takes time and trust. Be patient with yourself and others as you grow in transparency and vulnerability. It is worth it.
