


Is there more to life?

n Sunday, February 24, join us for a morning of church-wide service. Instead of the usual worship services, we'll serve at Houston Food Bank (HFB), or here at MDPC. For those traveling to the food bank, we'll board buses at 8:00 AM and travel to HFB to work side-by-side on projects that help feed Houston's hungry. (Registrants will be emailed their bus "color" shortly before the event, and may go straight to a blue or yellow bus - no check-in needed.)

Ages 6+ may serve at HFB; younger kids and their families will stay at **MDPC** to work on important, age-appropriate outreach projects. Folks of any age who prefer to stay and serve at **MDPC** are invited to do so. Just look for the "Serve at **MDPC**" form when you register.

Free childcare is provided for children ages two and under for those serving at **MDPC** or at HFB.

Lunch will be served in Fellowship Hall to both groups at the conclusion of the service projects. HFB participants will be served immediately upon their return to **MDPC**.

Though we won't spend the morning in pews, we'll still worship, hear the Word, and offer our gifts of gratitude.

PLEASE register ASAP so we can responsibly prepare for service projects, T-Shirts, and lunch. The \$10* per person fee includes the items listed above.

A few projects are in need of donations:

- We will be collecting gently-worn clothing for Gracewood and MAM (both MDPC mission partners). Please bring items to the donation bins located around campus before February 24 so that we may sort them on that morning. Socks and undergarments always are needed, but we ask that you only donate NEW items in this category.
- Sandwich bread is needed for our **Kids' Meals** project. Please bring plain loaves of white or wheat bread on February 24, and drop them off at the designated locations (those boarding buses will be able to drop bread at the bus loading zones).

SERMON NOTES

THIS IS US

The Story of Joseph's Family...and Ours

Favoritism, Jealousy, and Sibling Rivalry *Genesis 37:1-11* Alf Halvorson preaching We begin the New Year with a new sermon series on *Family Relationships and the Faith*. Most of us first pondered faith in and through our imperfect families. How has that positively, and potentially negatively, affected us? What baggage might we carry? What work might we need to do to overcome negative issues? How can being part of the family of faith help?

- 1. Describe your family of origin to the group. Were you an only child? First of four? A middle? The Baby? Do you think your birth order played any role in your upbringing? Was faith positively or negatively shared and instilled there?
- 2. The critically acclaimed TV drama "This Is Us" began airing in 2016 and now is in its third season. It's received many awards, including The People's Choice Award for Best New Drama. This Is Us tracks three children, Kevin and Kate and Randall, all born on the same day. Kevin and Kate's parents were to have triplets, but one of the babies dies during de-livery. The parents, Jack and Rebecca, believing they were to have three children, adopt a different-race baby who was left at a fire station that day by a struggling parent. The baby arrives at the hospital just in time for Jack and Rebecca to assuage their grief with this joy and challenge. The show, through present-day coverage of the family and flashbacks to critical times in the past, explores themes of trust, jealousy, love, addiction, disappointment, hate, insecurity, revenge, reconciliation, and faith. It has been a show that has helped me think about my own family of origin. If you have seen the show, why do you recommend it (or not) to your friends in the group?
- 3. Read Genesis 37:1-11. Remind each other who Jacob is: Who are his brothers, father, mother? What has been his life up to this point? Then get the basic facts straight on Joseph. How many brothers does he have? What is his order in that group? And how many mothers are in the picture beside Jacob? (See Genesis chapters 29-36)
- 4. In verses 1-4, what family dynamics are in play here? Who is the favorite? Why? How is that known? What is the result of this favoritism?
- 5. In your family of origin, who, in your mind, was the favorite? Who wore the "robe"? What are the pluses of being the favorite and what is the burden of being the favorite?
- 6. In verses 5-11, Joseph has two dreams. How could the sharing of those dreams have been handled differently by Joseph? By Joseph's brothers? By Jacob?
- 7. The result of this first episode in the Life of Jacob's Family (vs. 2) ends with hatred and jealousy (vs. 4, 5, 8, 11). Where is there hatred and jealousy in your family of origin? Or, in your immediate family now? I talked some about ways to respond if you find yourself in the parent or grandparent or mentor role. What might be necessary so that the hate and jealousy don't result in tragedy? Note: Next week I will talk more about being the favorite or not—being Joseph or one of the other brothers.
