





THIS IS US

The Story of Joseph's Family...and Ours

Family Secrets

Genesis 37:12-28 (NRSV) Alf Halvorson preaching This is the second in a series of sermons on the Story of Joseph. Last week, we focused on sibling rivalry, jealousy, and favoritism. This week, in addition to those topics, we add the hurt which can lead to horrific actions and cover-ups. Jealousy unresolved can lead to hate, broken relationships—and even murder. And it doesn't deliver what we hope it will.

- 1. From last week's sermon, what hit you about Joseph and his 11 brothers? About Jacob? About the behaviors that have been tolerated in this family?
- 2. When was a time you were jealous? What were the circumstances? How did you handle yourself? What do you wish you had done differently, if anything?
- 3. If you missed last week, read Genesis 37:1-11; otherwise, go immediately to Genesis 37:12-28. Read it now. What surprised you from the first six verses (vs. 12-17)? What is the relationship between Jacob and Joseph? And what is Jacob asking Joseph to do? How do you think Joseph's brothers would have reacted to this supervision or spying?
- 4. Verse 18 is a turning point in this passage. How do you think they knew from a distance it was Joseph? And why decide to kill him already? Does verse 19 help? Do they have a legitimate grievance? Why do Joseph's dreams threaten the rest so much? What might the dreams symbolize?
- 5. From verses 20-28, talk through the mindset of the various brothers, and the group as a whole. Who wants to do what, and why?
- 6. Read verses 29-36, just to see what happens next. How do the brothers cover up the "action" to their father? How does Jacob react? Do the brothers get what they had hoped for from their father?
- 7. If you had to summarize this first part of the Joseph Story using an Aesop's Fable Moral of the Story, what would you say it is? What do unresolved jealousy and hatred produce?
- 8. What might the brothers have done differently? In your life, is there an unresolved jealousy or hatred that you need to address? What should your next step be?
