




NEXT NEW MEMBER CLASS • SUMMER INTENSIVE!

This is the fourth in our series of messages on Psalm 23. I hope the series is broadening your picture of God to include God as the Good Shepherd, if it didn't already. Or that these conversations are filling in the picture of how the Shepherd cares for and sacrifices for the sheep, and how that parallels God's care and sacrifice for us. And that we, in some key aspects,

are like sheep.

Today's text, verse 5, seems to add another image in addition to Shepherd, and that is the image of *host*. Let's explore the concept of "host" and how God is the exemplar of hospitality.

- 1. Read Ps. 23:1-6; focus especially on verse 5.
- 2. When have you served as host to a guest or group of guests? What were your concerns? How did you try to prepare the place for your invitees? Where was your focus the entire time? What sacrifices did you make so the event or conversation was a positive one?
- 3. What has been one of your best and worst *guest* experiences? Why was it one or the other? What was done or left undone? How were you treated or mistreated?
- 4. I talked about the billboard campaign that started in Florida showing quotes signed by God. Have you seen any of them in your travels? Which ones do you like? Which ones give a skewed view of God? Which ones might lead us to a more faithful view of God?
- 5. In verse 5, according to King David, what does the text say God does for His people? There are three things listed. Discuss based on what I did and didn't say in my sermon.
 - How does God prepare a table for you?
 - How does God anoint your head with oil?
 - What does an overflowing cup look like in your life? And what does it mean?
- 6. I suggested this image in verse 5 might not be just a "host" image, but also another aspect of shepherding. In order to care for his sheep, a good shepherd prepares the *table* for them (that is the word often used for higher elevation pastures; *mesa* is Spanish for "table" or "table lands"). How did I suggest that a shepherd might prepare a "table" for the sheep regarding poisonous plants, snakes, and potential resting spots? Can you imagine God doing that in your life? Going before you to prepare the path and the rest stops? Share examples where you think that has happened in your life.
- 7. What must you think and do differently because of the first five verses of Psalm 23?
